

# PAID PARKING INFORMATION

## CITY OF NEWBURYPORT



The City of Newburyport is introducing paid parking in six downtown lots during the month of May, 2011. Below please find some useful information on the pay and display kiosks, times of operations, locations, and more.

### ABOUT PAID PARKING

The Parking Clerk's office manages public parking in the City of Newburyport which includes six paid parking lots and on-street parking.

Three of the six lots have a three hour limit; the remaining three lots have no time limit. Many of the streets have time limits of 2 hours or some other time period. Please look at the signs for specific time limits.

### HOW LONG CAN I STAY IN THE LOTS?

You can stay for **three hours** in the following lots:  
Waterfront Trust Lot, Green Street Lot, State Street Lot.

You can stay **all day** in the following lots:  
NRA East Lot, NRA West Lot, Prince Place Lot.

### WHERE ARE THE PAY & DISPLAY KIOSKS?

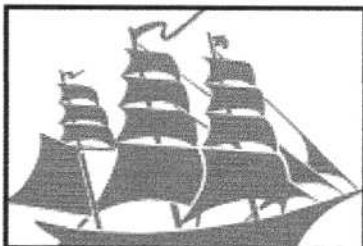
There are one or more kiosks in each parking lot. There is an easily identifiable sign "Pay Here" above each kiosk. The six parking lots are identified on the map on the reverse side of this brochure.

### WHAT DOES IT COST?

50 cents per hour

### WHEN ARE THE KIOSKS IN OPERATION?

The kiosks operate Monday through Saturday from 8 am to 6 pm and Sunday from 12 pm to 6 pm.



### RESIDENT PAID PARKING PERMITS

The parking office issues annual, discounted parking permits to residents and senior residents. The resident permits allow a vehicle to park in the six paid parking lots without paying a fee for each use. They are not for on-street parking; there is no fee to park on the streets.

**Applications** are online or in the office, however they need to be mailed in according to the instructions.

The following **fees** apply:

- Resident Paid Parking Permit: \$5.00 annually
- Senior Resident Paid Parking Permit: Free (65 years of age or older)

### VISIT US

Need to visit the parking office? The office is located in City Hall which is diagonally across from the Post Office at 60 Pleasant Street, Newburyport. ### HELPFUL TIPS

To ensure your parking experience is easy and uneventful during your visit to Newburyport, please follow the helpful tips below:

- Park lawfully. Observe time limits in the lots and on the streets. Do not park in restricted areas and always park within the lines of parking area.
- Use one of our three designated paid lots for all day parking.
- In the six paid lots, please display your receipt on the driver's side window; enforcement officers issue tickets if they cannot see the date and time stamp.
- Kiosks accept coins, dollar bills and major credit cards.
