

# Trail Rules

(Newburyport Parks and Recreation Ordinance Section 11-51)

The City of Newburyport's Clipper City Rail Trail is a paved, 10-foot-wide, 1.1-mile-long pathway from the commuter rail station to the Merrimack River.

## **Users:**

Pedestrians and bicyclists are welcome! Motorized vehicles are not allowed, except for wheelchairs and authorized maintenance and municipal vehicles.

## **Dogs:**

Dog-walkers are welcome but must keep their dogs on a short leash and clean up any animal waste.

## **Caution:**

All Trail Users should be alert, aware, and respectful of others. Keep to the right of the trail, and politely warn people when you are passing on the left. Bicyclists should yield to pedestrians. Please be mindful not to block the pathway. Use caution at the intersections with streets and spur trails.

## **Litter:**

Enjoy the trail and pack out any litter. Trash and recycling receptacles are available at the intersection with Washington St. and at the waterfront.

## **Respect:**

Respect the trail; avoid altering any of the plants, trees, sculptures, or equipment. Respect adjacent private property - please, no trespassing.

## **Fishing:**

Fishing is not allowed at the Rail Trail's overlooks, underpass, or boardwalk. Licensed fishing is allowed at nearby Cashman Park.
