"With respect to the public realm—streets, sidewalks, lighting, utilities, trees—design standards could be developed to guide municipal departments in design, construction and maintenance." and

WHEREAS Newburyport should set an example of good environmental design and practices; and

WHEREAS light pollution has a detrimental affect on plants and wildlife, including the causation of insects to be more visible to predators, birds to neglect their internal circadian clock that is aligned with the daily light-dark cycle, and mammals such as raccoons and deer needing the dark for mating and sleeping, and

WHEREAS approximately \$2.2 billion is spent nationally to light the night sky through unshielded lights, collectively producing over 14.7 million tons of carbon dioxide waste, and

I was able to get this done before I left. Attached is the vote to be taken by a majority of the Sewer Commissioners to declare the 3 parcels of land as surplus property. Also attached is the City Council vote, which must pass by a 2/3rds vote. The City Council vote declares the parcels surplus, transfers the parcels to the Mayor for the purpose of conveyance, and authorizes the Mayor to dispose of the parcels on such terms and conditions as the Mayor deems appropriate.

I assume that we will not have the survey plan ready for a while. The votes therefore refer to sketch plans you sent me and state that the parcels are "approximately shown" on those plans. I recommend you mark the parcels on each of the plans as "Surplus Land", write "115 Water Street" on the plans as a caption, and file them with the City Clerk. The approximate dimensions of the "Surplus Land" parcels may be included in the sketch plans if the final dimensions, as shown on the survey plan, are unlikely to change materially. I recommend adding after each dimension the sign "±" (for example, "20 feet ±").

I recommend the Assessor make a written determination of the value of each parcel (the City does not have to retain an independent appraiser). As you know, if any of the 3 parcels has a value in excess of \$25,000, the City must issue a request for proposals for that parcel (we can prepare the RFP). If the value of each parcel is less than \$25,000, the City may sell the parcels to the 3 abutters who have expressed an interest.


As noted in the memorandum you sent, we need a survey plan approved by the Plan Department at the Registry of Deeds to dispose of the 3 parcels. I recommend obtaining the Plan Department's approval prior to scheduling a closing.


Once the City has reached agreement on the price with the buyers, we will enter into a brief Purchase and Sale Agreement with each buyer. We will prepare deeds for the Mayor's signature. In addition to paying the purchase price, the purchasers are required under G.L. c. 44, §63A to pay real estate taxes on the parcel for the rest of FY 2012 and for the entire FY 2013 (this is because the Assessors won't be able to issue tax bills in the names of the buyers until FY 14). The amount of the taxes is calculated by multiplying the purchase price by the tax rate.

If the purchase price of any parcel exceeds \$500, the City is required under G.L. c. 44, §63 to use the proceeds from the sale of the parcel to pay down the indebtedness incurred by the City in acquiring the property. If no such indebtedness is outstanding, the City may use the funds for the other purposes set forth more particularly in G.L. c. 44, §63 (these other purpose must be related to the water enterprise if water enterprise funds were used to pay damages for the taking).

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED ZONING ORDINANCE

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Newburyport as follows:


THAT the Zoning Ordinance be amended pursuant to Section XII-B "Adoption and Amendment" as follows:

Section II: Definitions

Delete the text (definitions) of the following numbered terms, in their entirety, and replace said terms and definitions with the following (including illustrative diagrams):

- 19. Frontage. The uninterrupted length of the front lot line(s), as defined herein, whether straight or not, and is on:
 - A. A public way or a way which the City Clerk certifies is maintained and used as a public way; or
 - B. A way shown on a previously approved subdivision plan; or
 - C. A way that predates subdivision control that has, in the Planning Board's opinion, sufficient width, suitable grades, and adequate construction to provide for vehicular traffic, including emergency and snow removal vehicles, and the installation of utilities.
- 22. Lot area. An area of land which is determined by the limits of the lot lines of land under one (1) ownership bounding that area and expressed in terms of square feet or acres. When the distance between any two (2) points of lot lines is less than fifty (50) feet, measured in a straight line, the smaller portion of the lot which is bounded by such line and lot lines shall not be considered in computing minimum lot area unless the distance along such lot lines between such two points is less than one hundred and fifty (150) feet.


Lot Area Diagram: The area between the two points called out in the adjacent diagram would count toward lot area since the distance along the lot lines is less than 150 feet.




23. Lot, corner. A lot at the point of intersection of and abutting on two or more intersecting streets, the interior angle of intersection of the street lot lines, or extended lot lines in case of a curved street being not more than 135°. For purposes of this chapter, the yard adjacent to each street shall be considered a front yard; however, this will not affect designation of the front lot line.

Corner Lot Diagrams:

A corner lot has two front lot lines. The front lot line of greater length shall be known as the primary front lot line. When a corner lot has front lot lines of equal length, the owner shall designate a single front lot line as the primary front lot line, on the applicable plan and/or application. This shall be known as the primary front lot line.




Where the interior angle of intersecting street is less than 135 degrees, the lot shall be considered a corner lot.



- <u>25. Lot line. front.</u> The property line dividing a lot from the adjacent a single street right-of-way. In the case of a corner lot the front lot line of greater length shall be known as the primary front lot line. When a corner lot has front lot lines of equal length, the owner shall designate a single front lot line as the primary front lot line, on the applicable plan and/or application.
- 26. Lot line, rear. The property line most nearly opposite and furthest from the front lot line or primary front lot line in the case of corner lots.
- 27. Lot line. side. Any property line not a front or rear lot line.
- 28. Lot, nonconforming. A lot lawfully existing at the effective date of this ordinance, or any subsequent amendment thereto, which is not in accordance with all provisions of this ordinance.
- 50. Yard, front. The portion of a lot lying between the front line and the front setback line.
- 51. Yard, rear. The portion of a lot lying between the rear line and the rear setback line.
- 52. Yard, side. The portion of a lot lying between a side line and the corresponding side setback line and extending from the front yard to the rear yard. In the case of a lot of odd shape, any yard that is not a front yard or a rear yard shall be considered a side yard.

Yard Diagram: Setbacks are measured from all lot lines. Yards exist between lot lines and setback lines. Corner lots have two front setbacks.



Section VI: Dimensional Controls

Under VI-A "General regulations." delete the first paragraph in its entirety and replace said paragraph with the following:

Any structure hereafter altered, constructed, erected, placed, or converted for any use in any district shall be located on a lot only in conformance with the minimum requirements listed on the dimensional controls table and regulations in section VI-B unless specifically allowed by the special permit granting authority under a variance procedure or, in the case of nonconforming uses, structures or lots, in accordance with the provisions of G.L. c.40A, §6 and Section IX of the Ordinance.

Under VI-B "Lot areas." Add the following new subsections:

C. In addition to the minimum lot area and frontage requirements, lots shall be laid out in such a manner so that a square, with sides equal to eighty percent (80%) of the minimum frontage requirement for the zoning district in which it is located, can be placed within the lot with at least one point of the square lying on the front lot line with no portion of the square extending beyond the boundaries of the lot.



The Newburyport Elementary PTO's (Brown, Bresnahan and Molin) are requesting your permission to host the 8th Annual Spring Fever 5K road race and Family Fun Run on May 6, 2012. Last year the proceeds generated from this popular event were over \$20,000. 5K Race Route (see attached map):

Greetings,

I would like to ask the city of Newburyport to grant the Newburyport Labor Day Festival permission to hold a 3 day event in downtown Newburyport which would include Market Square, Inn Street, the Waterfront Fark and boardwalk creas. The event would be during the day on September 1, 2 & 3, 2012 from 7:00am until 5:00pm. The event will include food vendors primarily on the bulinose in Market Square, crafters on Inn Street, and charity tables in Market Square. We do not anticipate the need for a stage, last year we organized enterteiners to use the brick pavement which worked out just fine.

I am also requesting additional berrels from the Newburyport DFW to be dispersed in the downtown area and additional extra large trash bags, brooms, shovels for maintenance. I can coordinate that with the DPW director. The immates from the Middle Jail came each day for cleanup detail which we will solicit again.

Thank you for taking the time to review my request for approving the roads and date for the 2012 Green Stride Half Marathon. We would like to first request the date of October 21st, 2012 as race day. The 2011 race had much success and we look forward to making this an annual event.

The roads in Newburyport being requested for the Green Stride race on October 21st, 2012 are as follows:

- Water Street from Federal Street continuing onto Merrimac Street.
- Merrimac Street to Spofford Street.
- Spofford Street to Ferry Road.
- Ferry Road to Pine Hill Road
- Pine Hill Road to Curzon Mill Road
- Curzon Mill Road to Hovts Lane
- Hovts Lane to Story Ave.
- Story Ave to Turkey Hill Road
- Turkey Hill Road, right onto Plummer Spring Road (3 miles into West Newbury currently being approved)
- Turkey Hill Road from West Newbury onto Hale Street
- Hale Street to Toppans Lane
- Toppans Lane to High Street.
- High Street from Toppans Lane to Federal Street
- Federal Street to Water Street

As of now, the course has not changed much. The only exception being the final leg where the runners ran on the end of the Raii Trail along the river for the finish. We are requesting that this portion be removed and replaced with a finish along the main road. Even though it was a really nice finish, we found that there was some trouble with walkers trying to walk along the path as well as runners trying to run through the Cashman parking lot with some obstructions. The finish line also gave some problems with spectators trying to watch as people finished. There was not much room for them as the area was light.

Another request the Green Stride asks for is to use the Newburyport Waterfront as its hosting location. This year the race is expected to have larger numbers, and we fee! that both the runners and the city would benefit from moving to this location. Having all the runners congregate to the downtown setting would help local businesses thrive on this day. Also, by moving the stan line to Water and State St, the race would essentially move through downtown and the Route 1 intersection quickly, thus helping with traffic. The finish line would be south of downtown, into the parking lot behind the Black Dog Store. Post race festivities would take place in this location. Please see the attached map for the area the event would like to take place.

As far as parking, Green Stride plans to put an aggressive plan in place that will map out available lots throughout Newburyport. We will then hire numerous buses to continuously do pick-ups and drop-offs throughout the day. This should help alleviate heavy traffic into downtown.

Also, as we are uncertain at the moment what costs and fees are associated with using the downtown location to host, however, if they are minimal, Green Stride would be happy to make a considerable donation (\$2,000-\$4,000 depending on turnout) to a charity of choice requested by the Newburyport City Council.

The Greater Newburyport Chember of Commerce & Industry kindly requests the use of the streets in the downtown for the following Chember of Commerce sponsored festivals:
