



Call Firefighter request

I am requesting your support for the hiring of six (6) new call firefighters. As you know having enough personnel on scene of an emergency is critical to the success of any emergency response. With a limited number of full time firefighters on duty our call firefighters over the years have been critical to our success in operating at the scene of numerous incidents. But because of promotions and retirements the number of call firefighters in our department has been drastically reduced to its present number of six (6) members.

We have requested during numerous budget meetings over the years that the number of call firefighters should be increased or we would be faced with a severe shortage of this valuable resource. That time has come. With the promotion of call firefighter/dispatcher Marc Ouellet to a full time firefighter position and the hiring of call firefighter Matt Houle to fill the dispatch opening this has left us with only five (5) call firefighters available to respond to an incident. Even with the dedication of these personnel their immediate availability is uncertain at any time due to work and family commitments. This number will drop even lower within the next year with the expected retirements of some full time firefighters and the expected promotion of a number of our call firefighters to replace these personnel.

I am requesting the hiring of six (6) new call firefighters to help fill the present void. Even though this number will not completely fill the void it will bring our call department to twelve and help with our present shortage. We have learned through the years that six new members appointed at a time is a manageable number to train and to track at an emergency incident. Even though they are appointed to the position they must undergo extensive training before they can safely operate at the scene of an emergency. This training will include the call/volunteer training program that is sponsored by the state fire academy and the county chiefs association. This training may take up to a year but it is for the safety of both the new call firefighter and our other personnel. Any

number less than the six (6) requested will have little impact on the number of persons available for responses.

With our call firefighters being civil service we have also found that requesting a list for this many positions should give us a solid list of candidates to choose from. This gives us a better chance at interviewing candidates that may have some prior experience and this would be beneficial to us. Being able to hire someone with prior experience would reduce the amount of training time needed to allow that member to operate on an emergency scene. This would increase the number of personnel available to us in a shorter period of time.

For years our call firefighters have been used to fill the ranks of retiring full time firefighters. With civil service allowing us to promote call firefighters with three (3) years of service to full time we have a chance to train and evaluate our personnel. If we wish to continue with this practice we must maintain a solid call firefighter force.

I have attached a sheet outlining the initial expenses for the hiring. This includes physicals and equipment. The initial hiring is the most costly time period for our new personnel. The annual salary for a call firefighter is only \$1,000.00 a year. We have enough in our present budget to cover the salaries till the end of the present fiscal year. I have not included the cost of pagers in the attached list because those will need to be purchased as part of our capital plan to replace the pagers for the entire department.

The hiring of these six (6) would be a start in replenishing the number of call firefighters. With an aging full time staff and the expected retirements over the next couple of years there needs to be a commitment to replace the call firefighters on a regular basis. I believe a staff of fifteen to eighteen call firefighters would be an adequate number to help support our full time firefighters and give the city a solid base for filling full time positions.

Thank you very much for your assistance with this request.



Note: I recommend that we put on six (6) new personnel initially this year. This is a manageable number to train at one time. We have enough in salaries to get through the year with the six. I did not put in the money for pagers because those are included as part of our capital plan to purchase new narrow band compliant pagers for the entire department. The total request would then be \$34,000.

# MEMORANDUM

RE: Local Option Increasing Board Members' Stipend Section 34 of Chapter 176 of the Acts of 2011

DATE: January 5, 2012

As you know, Section 34 of Chapter 176 of the Acts of 2011 re-wrote G.L. c. 32, § 20(6) creating a new local option provision that replaces the current \$3,000 local option and allows for an increase in the stipend paid to members of Retirement Boards. The language of this section that becomes effective on February 16, 2012 is set forth below. It can be adopted at any time after February 16, 2012.

The local option allows the Board Member stipend to be increased to an amount not less than \$3,000 and not more than \$4,500. If the local option is accepted, the *ex officio* Board Member shall receive an annual stipend of not more than \$4,500 in the aggregate for services rendered in the active administration of the Retirement System. It should be noted that the *ex officio* Board member cannot receive more than the amount accepted by the local option. For example, if he or she is receiving \$1,500 for services rendered in the active administration the system pursuant to G.L. c. 32 § 20, he or she may receive the stipend in an amount so that the aggregate of the payments for services and the stipend equals the total amount of the Board Member Compensation.

This local option is accepted by a vote of the legislative body. The legislative body in a city is the city council subject to its charter; in a town, the town meeting; in a county, the county retirement board advisory council; in a region, by a vote of the regional retirement board advisory council; in a district, the district members; and for an authority, its governing body. The Retirement Board is not included in the acceptance process, but may wish to bring the availability to the attention of the legislative body. The Retirement Board must notify the Commission of the local legislative body's acceptance and provide certified copies of the votes.


If the Board has adopted the local option that is contained in G.L. c. 32, § 20(6) prior to the amendment, that acceptance remains in effect. In order to increase the stipend to an amount up to \$4,500, the new local option must be accepted. If the Board has not accepted the \$3,000 local option, the new option can be accepted as outlined in the statute. In either case, the amount of the stipend (from \$3,000 to \$4,500) must be included in the acceptance vote.

Section 34 of Chapter 176 of the Acts of 2011

SECTION 34 Said section 20 of said chapter 32, as so appearing, is hereby further amended by striking out subdivision (6) and inserting in place thereof the following subdivision:-

(6) Retirement Board Members Compensation.-The elected and appointed members of a city, town, county, regional, district or authority retirement board upon the acceptance of the appropriate legislative body shall receive a stipend; provided, however, that the stipend shall not be less than \$3,000 per year and not more than \$4,500 per year; provided, further, that the stipend shall be paid from funds under the control of the board as shall be determined by the commission; and provided, further, that an ex-officio member of a city, town, county, district or authority retirement board upon the acceptance of the appropriate legislative body shall receive a stipend of not more than \$4,500 per year in the aggregate for services rendered in the active administration of the retirement system.
