



Re: Meals on Wheels

I received a call last week from the Methodist Church on Purchase St. that their Board voted to terminate the Meals on Wheels program's use of their church facilities effective May 1, 2013. Meals on Wheels for our region is managed by the Merrimack Valley Nutrition Project (MVNP) at the Greater Lawrence Regional Technical High School; the Newburyport site serves Newburyport, Newbury and Rowley. The program operates Monday through Fridays and delivers approximately 105 meals daily with another 4-6 meals served on site.

MVNP staffs the program with one Director, Cindy Rand, a Newburyport resident, and an assistant. There are 8 drivers who volunteer and receive a small gas stipend. MVNP provides a small stipend of \$100 to the site. The remaining costs of \$1600/month have been covered with \$500/month grant from Pennies for Poverty, donations and the church. The church is no longer in a position to pay the \$1100/month which covers custodial services, utilities and some supplies. Pennies for Poverty will continue to cover the \$500/month through the grant period to August of 2013 and a renewal request must then be submitted for the following year. I have been in touch with the Chair, Michael Sandberg, who anticipates funding to continue for another year.

Central Congregational Church on Titcomb St. is willing to house the program until we find a permanent home at the Senior/Community Center in the fall of 2015.


I am requesting a transfer of \$2200 from Free Cash for the months of May and June to ensure this very important program continues to operate in our City for some of the most needy seniors and individuals with disabilities. We will address FY14 needs through the budget process.

President Thomas O'Brien and City Councilor Robert Cronin have agreed to co-sponsor this initiative.

Thank you for allowing me this opportunity to express my interest in serving on the Board of the Newburyport Housing Authority. It would be an honor to serve the City in this capacity. Please review my qualifications below and in the attached resumé, which I hope will meet with your approval.

My work in affordable housing started with the construction of a number of projects on behalf of municipal and non-profit housing institutions, through my role as project manager at L.D. Russo, Inc. 




