



At the request of the Mayor, I would like to send along additional information on the proposed DPS Administration Building. Unlike the previous submission on May 28, 2013, these transfers are now broken out as separate items so that the City Council may take them up separately, if desired.

As a matter of background, the expansion to the DPS site was originally discussed during the FY2011 budget process, when \$350,000 was appropriated for the Water Division and \$250,000 was appropriated for the Sewer Division. These funds would have allowed DPS to begin work on a conceptual design. However, with two large-scale rehabilitation projects taking place, we found it necessary to wait on the new building until both plant projects were well underway. On June 27, 2011, the City Council voted favorably (10 yes, 1 absent) to transfer the \$600,000 in FY2011 funds to a capital reserve account, so that the work could begin at a later date.

With an end in sight for the construction projects at the Water Treatment Plant and Wastewater Treatment Facility, the department will now have the time it needs to oversee construction of an administration building. As you may be aware, employees are currently working out of two construction trailers, which were meant to be temporary, but have since been in use for at least seven years. At less than 1,500 square feet combined, the trailers are too small to provide adequate working and storage space for our water distribution crew, sewer collection system crew and engineering team. Due to their poor condition, the trailers often suffer from rain damage and are highly energy inefficient.

For the design of the new administration building, the committee reviewed RFQ's from four architect/designers and recommended the selection of CSS Architects. The scope of work will include the design and construction of a new administration building at the existing DPS site located on Perry Way in Newburyport. The conceptual drawings show the proposed space at just under 6,000 square feet, which is important to note since there was some confusion based on the previous memo. As shown on the attached drawings, the proposed space would complement the DPS consolidation well by housing the water crew, sewer crew, engineering team, and business office all on the same site as the DPS headquarters. It will also provide necessary training and meeting space, which currently does not exist at the site.


Based on their initial evaluation and a review of similar facilities across the region, the architects approximate a total project cost of \$1.2 million, consisting of \$960,000 in construction costs (6,000 sq. ft. at \$160/sq. ft.), \$100,000 in architectural/engineering-related costs, and a 10% contingency. In order to meet the proposed project milestone schedule, it would be necessary for the transfers to be approved on or before July 15th, which is when retained earnings are locked up for certification by the Department of Revenue until later in the fall.






A reasonable but economical study can be done for \$35,000. A more generous budget would be \$50,000.

The Central Waterfront Bulkhead and Pilings Project is focused on repairing the aging bulkheads that support the Peter J. Matthews Boardwalk at the central waterfront, the Commercial Fish Pier, and the pilings that anchor the seasonal floats for private boats and commercial tour boats. This infrastructure is used by tens of thousands of people every year, and public investment in the bulkheads is vital to the City's economy and quality of life.


The various bulkhead structures at the central waterfront were built primarily in 1977 and 1987, and after several decades they are nearing, or are at, the end of their service life. Patched in 2008, the steel mooring and fender pilings used to tie up the floats and boats are in poor condition and need long-term replacement. The large sinkhole that was temporarily plugged in 2010 behind the rip-rap near the Harbormaster's office is beginning to open back up again. The lower portion of the bulkhead at the Commercial Fish Pier has deteriorated to the point where it is in danger of structural failure in the next few years. A line of pinholes is opening up in the cellular steel bulkheads underwater and the weep-holes are corroding, widening, and allowing material through which will eventually lead to undermining the boardwalk's foundations if left unchecked. Please see the attached images of existing conditions.

The Bulkhead Project is intended to address this advancing deterioration so that we can repair the system and extend its life for several more decades rather than waiting for the sinkholes, structural failure, loss of public access, and increased costs that are inevitable should these extensive corrosion issues not be remediated. The purpose of the project is to have the bulkheads function in the same manner for the next generation as they have for the past generation.

The City is legally obligated to repair and maintain the bulkheads through the public trust agreement of 1991 that established the Waterfront Trust. After nearly a decade of seeking grant funding for the bulkheads, the City successfully secured a state grant in 2011 from the Seaport Advisory Council (SAC) for \$1.98 million to be spent in FY13 and FY14. In addition, the Harbor Commission, the Waterfront Trust, and the Redevelopment Authority have each committed \$25,000 to the project, bringing current available funding to \$2,055,000. The City hired Bourne Consulting Engineers (BCE) in November 2012 as the marine engineer for the project, and BCE's cost estimates for the long-term comprehensive repairs total about \$5 million. The proposed first phase of work, including design, permitting, construction, contingency, and construction administration, is estimated at \$2,336,250. Please see the attached budget summaries. The funding gap is \$281,250.

The first phase of work will address the components of the bulkhead system in the worst condition, including the eastern bulkhead along the City's Fish Pier, the rip-rap section, the western cellular bulkhead and the associated pilings. The SAC has indicated that we need to spend the grant in FY14, and we respectfully request that you approve the gap funding of \$281,250 so that we can leverage this \$1.98 million state grant and initiate the project. Should the project come in under budget, the remaining unused balance of this transfer request will be returned to Free Cash. While the SAC is open to considering supplementary funding applications for future phases of work, all new funding requests to the SAC are currently on hold. Thank you for your consideration.








