

As required by the applicable statute, notice of the Council's hearing on this application, scheduled for <u>June 8</u>, has been published today (May 29) and is also being sent by certified mail to all abutters – both more than seven days prior to the June 8 hearing.

You may recall that Tropic Star's overall project involves (1) removing the existing Shell Station from the corner of Storey Avenue and Low Street, (2) constructing a new, replacement Shell Station with convenience store at the Property, (3) constructing a new pharmacy at the corner of Storey Avenue and Low Street, and (4) donating approximately 21-acres of open space behind the pharmacy to the City of Newburyport. For a conceptual depiction, see the Site Plan and Rendering included in Exhibit D hereto. The Zoning Board of Appeals issued a Special Permit for Use on September 25, 2014 approving the proposed new Shell Station that is the subject of this application. The Planning Board also issued a Site Plan Approval for the project (including the pharmacy component) on October 10, 2014.

The key points related to this license application are as follows:

- 1. The new service station will replace the existing Shell Station at the corner of Storey Avenue and Low Street.
- 2. The new station will have more storage capacity than the existing Shell Station, requiring fewer tanker deliveries to the site. The increased capacity is due in part to the new station including a tank for E85 fuel, which is not offered at the existing Shell Station. E85 is a new gasoline/ethanol blend that the USEPA is pushing to reduce emissions by increasing the percentage of ethanol in gas to 85%. The new station will also continue to offer E15 as the main product.
- 3. Fuel tank technology has improved over the years. All new tanks will be double wall fiberglass tanks, with a state-of-the-art leak detection system. This technology is an upgrade over the tanks used at the existing Shell Station.
- 4. The new tanks and fuel piping will comply with the new MassDEP UST regulations that went into effect January 2, 2015.
- 5. The Fire Department has reviewed and approved this Application for License as noted on page two of the application form.

Accordingly, Tropic Star and Giena of Newburyport, LLC respectfully request that the City Council approve the enclosed application and endorse and issue the License included in Exhibit B hereto.

The fire department is hereby requesting a transfer of \$110,000.00 from three (3) line items within the NFD budget to cover cost overruns in the overtime line item. The overtime account is continually underfunded by approximately \$100,000.00 in each year's budget. This time last year the NFD requested a \$100,000.00 transfer out of free cash to cover overruns in the overtime line. This year, not unexpectedly, we once again must seek a transfer. However, this year there are other extenuating circumstances that further strained the account:

- 1. In the new contract, along with increases in wages, the city agreed to host an EMT course for those firefighters that did not have their EMT certification. The cost of shift coverage for those attending this three-month-long class came to \$13,567.84.
- 2. Firefighter Matt Houle attended the Massachusetts State Firefighting Academy as part of the hiring and certification requirements. The cost to send Matt to the academy and cover his shifts came to \$16,436.65.
- 3. Several firefighters were out on extended leave for injuries suffered in the line of duty. Two firefighters injured their rotator cuffs and required surgeries. FF Cutter is back to work. FF Elwell, who tore both rotator cuffs, is still out and is approaching one year. He expects to be back at work by the end of this month. Also out injured were Lt. Rick

Thurlow and Firefighter Tony Raven. Fortunately, they are back at work and healthy. The cost of covering those extended injury vacancies amounted to \$74,788.67.

4. The extended coverage, emergencies during, and clean-up after our tremendous storms this winter took a toll, not only on this line item, but on our personnel as well. The extended exposure also added to the use of sick time as our run-down personnel caught ever flu bug circulating. The coverage for the storms amount to \$15,409.60, with sick leave throughout the year amounting to \$78,706.79.

These items alone amount to \$198,909.55. This does not account for vacation or personal days, bereavement, emergency call-back, training, mutual aid, or city events such as Yankee Homecoming Week, Riverfest, etc.

The good news is that the insurance company that provides for our Worker's Compensation, Cabot Risk, has reimbursed the NFD for lost wages due to the long term injuries suffered by our personnel throughout the year in the amount of \$99,428.57. These funds returned to the NFD budget to offset wages and benefits paid. This is part of the reason we are able to ask for an internal transfer and not a request from free cash. Other items on the plus side include:

- 1. Lease of Vehicles Lease payments budgeted in this year's budget are not due until next year, so there is a surplus of \$77,000.00 to be applied to the transfer.
- 2. Fuel Oil Lower than expected pricing and usage resulted in a surplus of \$17,500.00 to be applied to the transfer.
- 3. Protective Clothing Protective clothing purchases were delayed until the last quarter of the fiscal year. The purchases have now been postponed due to the deficit in the budget. The line item of \$12,500.00 can therefore be applied to the transfer.

Transfer for Senior Community Center Project

We are writing to respectfully request the City Council to authorize a transfer of \$100,000 from Free Cash to the Senior Community Center capital account in order to fully cover the projected costs of the project. Construction is scheduled to be substantially completed this September 2015.

In the spring of 2012, the community voted to approve \$6.5 million for the design and construction of the project. Soft costs for design, permitting, project management, and construction oversight have been about \$840,000, approximately 12% of the total project cost. However, when the project was advertised for construction two years later in 2014, the lowest bid came in \$450,000 over the professional itemized cost estimate due primarily to higher than expected sub-bid prices for various trades. The City had sufficient funding to contract with a very capable general contractor and initiate the project, but not enough to cover the projected cost of furnishings, construction contingency for projected change orders, testing, etc.

A fund-raising committee was formed and a very successful fund-raising campaign has been implemented that has resulted in pledges of approximately \$280,000 and \$130,000 received in hand to date. At the same time, the City has worked with the contractor to delete and credit various items and to hold change orders to a minimum (approximately 2-3%). Consequently, we have been able to reduce the funding gap. However, there is still a financial gap and there are 3-4 months of construction remaining as well as the need to bid out the furnishings this summer to coincide with the completion of the new facility in the fall. We therefore respectfully request the transfer of \$100,000 to fully cover the projected expenses of this much anticipated facility. Thank you for your consideration.

Transfer for culvert project

The City was informed in August 2014 by the new owner of the former Davis Electric Building property that a brick culvert runs through his property and under his building. He purchased the property to develop it into the "Ale House," which has recently been approved by the Planning Board and other local and State permitting authorities. The owner uncovered this culvert when he was doing his own exploratory digging in preparation of designing his foundation. I immediately directed the DPS to survey the culvert and determine its location and its purpose.

The DPS Engineering Department performed a thorough survey – size, location, depth, photos, and video recordings from the manhole near the Black Cow all the way past Merrimac Street and into Green Street. They determined that it does, in fact, collect roadway runoff from both Green and Merrimac Streets and discharges to an outfall at the boat ramp next to the Black Cow (see attached). It not only runs under the old Davis Electric Building but also runs under the Brown's Wharf Building (Port City Sandwich, etc.) and the adjacent Hudson Building (Chamber of Commerce, etc.).


DPS hired John O'Connell, Registered Structural Engineer, to assist in this effort. They looked at the culvert's condition under all three buildings and determined that it needs to be repaired or replaced soon. The condition of the culvert beneath the Brown's Wharf and Hudson Buildings is in poor condition. The culvert under those two buildings collapsed decades ago and was repaired in one location using corrugated metal arch pipe (CMP) and in another location spanning the culvert with timber planks to act as a ceiling. The CMP and timber planks are now corroded and rotted.


We looked at various options – slip-lining; inserting a smaller pipe within the culvert; repointing and structurally repairing the culvert; and relocating it outside the footprints of the buildings. We determined that relocating it is clearly the only sensible option:


- 1. Slip-lining is impossible with so many different materials and irregular shapes (CMP arch, timber plank ceiling, deformed brick cross-section, etc.).
- 2. Inserting a smaller pipe is virtually impossible from a constructability standpoint and would not make the situation much safer.
- 3. Re-pointing the brick culvert and repairing it structurally in-place does not address what to do with the CMP arch pipe nor timber plank ceiling. Repairing the CMP and timbers is impractical due to their condition. They need to be replaced.

Relocating the culvert and filling the existing culvert with concrete will cost the least to the City and reduce our risk. (See attached relocation and abandonment Plans.) We looked at relocating only a portion of it around the Ale House in order to spread out the total relocation costs over multiple fiscal years and to help expedite the construction of the Ale House but we do not suggest doing so. Constructing it in sections will cost the City tens of thousands more because of the extra work involved. It makes the most sense to relocate the entire culvert under one construction project to save the most money. A construction cost estimate is still being prepared pending the results of an environmental soils analysis by GZA.


We will continue to work with the owners to assist us financially in this work.












DOWNSTREAM OF ENTRY LOOKING UPSTREAM TOWARDS MERRIMAC ST.

























Water/Sewer Budget Reserve Transfers


In March of 2009 and August of 2010, the City Council voted favorably to authorize the issuance of debt, which would allow the City to embark on two major rehabilitation projects impacting our sewer and water systems. Given the age and condition of the Wastewater Treatment Facility and Water Treatment Plant, we knew the projects were not going to be easy, or inexpensive, but we did know that, in order to protect Newburyport's water and sewer system, the work had to be done and it had to be done right.


The FY2016 budgets for the Water and Sewer Enterprise Funds show total debt principle and interest of \$1,844,632 and \$2,256,436 respectively. Since 2014, the Water and Sewer Undesignated Fund Account has appropriated reserves to stabilize the Water and Sewer rate increases. As such, the purpose of the attached transfers is to mitigate the impact of rising debt service costs on ratepayers in the next fiscal year.

For water, the Water Commission recommends reserving \$450,000 in retained earnings for the purpose of stabilizing rates. For the typical household, instead of seeing a \$64 rise in water costs for next year, they will instead see an increase of \$16, or 3.6% from current rates. You may recall that Russell Consulting originally showed a total increase of \$88 per year for the typical household to fund the WTP Project.

For sewer, the Sewer Commission recommends reserving \$500,000 in retained earnings for the purpose of stabilizing rates. For the typical household, instead of seeing an \$84.00 rise in sewer costs for next year, they will instead see an increase of \$26 or 4% from current rates. You may recall that Weston & Sampson originally projected a total increase \$153 per year to fund the WWTF Project.

I thank you for taking the time to review the attached information.



- (a) "Procedure" All road racing, walkathon, bicycle, or swimming events shall, through that event's organizer, board of directors, charity foundation or designee apply for authorization to hold the event through the Office of the City Clerk. The City Clerk upon review of the completed form will place the application on the regular City Council agenda. Upon following the procedures of the Council, as deemed appropriated in the sole judgment of the Council, the application will be considered approved if the Council votes favorably by majority. The event will name one person responsible on the application and shall provide contact information to include name, address and telephone number.
- (b) "Exemptions" Each event organizer or organization shall comply with this ordinance and no exemptions will be permitted.
- (c) "Course map", All applications shall be accompanied by a course map showing the event route, water stops, refreshment stops, and so-called "porta-potties". The course map shall also include any road closures, detours and parking areas. The course map shall be approved by Police, Fire, Department of Public Services, Parks Commission and Harbormasters Departments prior to submission to the City Clerk.
- (d) "Electronic Amplifier" Electronic amplifiers, loudspeakers and bullhorn use shall be requested at time of application. Under no circumstances will they be used for public address announcements or music before 8:00 A.M. except for Sundays when electronic amplifiers, loud speakers or bullhorns will be used for public address announcements or music before 9:00 AM. This shall be deemed a requirement for all permitted events regardless of type or location.
- (e) "Road Closure" No ways, public or private, boat ramps or parking lots controlled or patrolled by the city shall be closed without authorization. Authorization shall be considered granted only if said closure(s) are contained in the approved permit. It is the sole responsibility of the race organizers to notify residents ten (10) days in advance that neighborhood roads will be closed if no alternate route is available to those residents.

- (f) "Insurance" All events shall have an insurance policy or rider in effect for the event naming the "City of Newburyport" as an insured. The policy shall be no less than two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00).
- (g) "Event termination" If in the judgment of the City Marshal, Fire Chief or Department of Public Services (DPS) Director or designees thereof determine that an event is unsafe due to existing conditions, that event may be stopped, terminated or suspended. In the case of a multidiscipline event such as a triathlon, the Harbormaster or his/her designee may likewise stop, terminate or suspend the swimming portion for cause.
- (h) "Event and traffic Security" The City Marshal, Fire Chief, DPS Director or in the case of a triathlon, the Harbormaster can require special duty personnel to oversee the safety and security of the event. All special duty assignments will be paid by the event organizers.





FY16 Proposed Budget

Enclosed please find the FY16 proposed budget which includes expenditures of \$59,098,570 balanced by non-tax levy revenues totaling \$8,773,414 and estimated tax levy of \$50,678,964. The FY16 operating budget represents a 4.3% increase over last year's budget and 5.0% increase when factoring in excluded debt service. Copies of the proposed budget were made available to Councilors on May 14.

As we slowly emerge from these challenging economic times, we have made difficult but deliberative choices to ensure our City is on solid financial ground over the past five and a half years. We have moved forward on long overdue infrastructure needs and are working diligently to address the growing list of streets and sidewalks in need of repair. We must also remain dedicated to rebuilding our school programs and this year's budget demonstrates my continued commitment to doing so.

Although we are presenting a budget that allows us to maintain current level of programs and services, we must continue to be vigilant in efficiently managing these resources and maximizing benefits provided across the City. The development of this comprehensive budget and capital plan was a team effort and I am very grateful to the Finance Team members: Julie Languirand, Treasurer, Dan Raycroft, Assessor, and especially Peter Lombardi, former Director of Policy & Administration and Ethan Manning, Finance Director/Auditor. Mr. Lombardi and Mr. Manning deserve much credit and recognition for their diligence in preparing this FY 2016 budget. We are proud to submit this budget to you for consideration and look forward to working with you over the coming weeks to finalize this process and begin FY16.

We feel that this is a great opportunity to highlight and assist the Pleasant Street community. I look forward to answering any questions that the council may have. Thank you for your consideration.



It is hereby agreed that, by signing and presenting this application, signer(s) represents to the City of Newburyport that the following statements are true and correct, and agrees to and will abide by the following:

- 1. All residents living on the street or block for which the party is planned request the Block party, or have been contacted and do not object to the Block Party.
- 2. To be responsible for placement, maintenance and removal of barricades.
- 3. A block party permit does not allow the sale of alcohol or the consumption of alcohol on public property (in city streets, sidewalks, parks, etc.) alcohol is allowed only on private property. All state and city alcohol laws still apply during Block Parties.
- 4. Amplified music shall be permitted with permission of the City Council.
- 5. To leave AT LEAST a TWELVE (12) FOOT AISLE in the street to permit passage of emergency vehicles or vehicles of residents. Failure to maintain a ten foot aisle during the entire period of the party will necessitate denial of requests for subsequent block parties. Public safety personnel will monitor the party for strict adherence to this rule.


SUBJECT: City-Wide Sidewalk Specifications

The goals of these specifications are to have both public and private construction projects; design, engineer and build sidewalks in a consistent and uniform method. These specifications offer choices on the type of sidewalk materials and designs that should meet most neighborhood characteristics.


BRICK SIDEWALK CROSS SECTION FOR CEMENT BASE

I recently learned that a seat on the City of Newburyport (City) conservation commission will be available in the near future and I am very interested in serving our community by volunteering for a seat on the commission. I have been a resident of the City for the past three years and have worked as a civil and water resources engineer at Geosyntec Consultants, Inc. (Geosyntec) for the past 11 years. Much of my career at Geosyntec has focused on stormwater management, green infrastructure design and environmental permitting, including permitting through the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MADEP) wetland regulations. 

ORDER AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO GRANT AN ACCESS EASEMENT IN LAND ON SPOFFORD STREET IN THE CITY OF NEWBURYPORT

WHEREAS, pursuant to a deed recorded with the Essex South Registry of Deeds in Book 1771, Page 529, the City is the owner of an unnumbered parcel of land approximately forty (40) feet in width throughout its length located between Assessors' Lots 71-39 and 71-39A to the Northeast and Assessors' Lots 71-38 and 71-37 to the Southwest (the "Property"); which Property provides access from Spofford Street to other land of the City known as Assessors' Lot 112-3; and

WHEREAS, the Property is held in the care, custody, and control of the Newburyport Water and Sewer Commission, as affirmed by the City Council's vote of January 29, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the Owner of Assessors' Lot 71-37 (4R Belcher Street) seeks an easement in the Property to access his lot;

WHEREAS, in accordance with Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 40, Section 3, the City may convey an interest in its land upon proper authorization; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 40, Section 15A, upon determination by a board or officer having charge of land that such land is no longer needed for such purpose, the City Council may, by a two-thirds vote, transfer the care, custody, management and control of all or a part of the such land to the same or another board or officer of the City for another specific municipal purpose; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 40, Section 15A the Water and Sewer Commission has determined, and has provided written notice to the Council of its determination, that the Property is not needed exclusively for water and/or sewer purposes, and that the City Council may transfer such care, custody and control of the Property as is necessary to allow for the conveyance of a permanent easement for access purposes in said parcel to serve Assessor's Lot 71-37, provided that the Water and Sewer Commission shall continue to hold the Property in its entirety, as it may be subject to such easement, in its care, custody and control for water and/or sewer purposes, and the easement granted shall not conflict with such purposes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Newburyport City Council as follows:

Dear President and Members of the City Council;

We, James T. Leonard and Ann M. Leonard are the owners of 4 Belcher Street. From the time we bought our property in 1978 until recently, we believed our property consisted of 44,180 square feet. That size was indicated on the Assessor's Maps and of course we have been paying taxes on the Assessor's assumption that the property was 44,180 square feet. Because of this calculation, we always have been under the impression that as a result we could split the lot in two for a second house lot. Indeed, on two occasions the former building inspector, Mr. Edward Hewett also opined that the property was 44,180 square feet and therefore was sufficient for two house lots. (Attached)

More recently we have entered into a purchase and sale agreement for the sale of our property and the Buyer undertook due diligence with regard to the size of the lot and the ability to create two house lots. What has been discovered is that notwithstanding the square footage as set forth on the Assessor's Plans and records, the property is actually 40,353./ square feet. This of course has put us in an unexpected predicament and certainly has or will impact what we have always thought would be a part of our retirement.

That having been said, there is a potential solution. Belcher Street is unconstructed starting at the back side of Plant Street. While we need a portion

of Belcher Street to remain a city street so our house has legal frontage, the end of Belcher Street serves no purpose and is unconstructed. We ask that the City abandon the end of Belcher Street as set forth on the plans and allow us to purchase same. We have worked with our neighbor, the Beauparlants, and they are agreeable to this solution, which in our minds is very unfortunate.

We ask that you discontinue and abandon the unconstructed end of Belcher Street as indicated on the plan and sell it to us so that we can add that area to our property and actually have sufficient area as we have always been under the impression that we have had.







We are writing to respectfully request that the City Council authorize the finalization of the 1.5 mile legal right-of-way for the Clipper City Rail Trail Phase II in order to meet federal and state requirements for federal-aid projects. We have been working directly with the various abutting landowners of the old rail corridor for a number of years on the right-of-way as well as the design of the project. The general objective has been to legally secure the public trail corridor in a manner that minimizes impacts on abutters and meets the requirements of MassDOT and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) so that the City can leverage approximately \$4 million in federal and state construction funding. The package of orders prepared by the City Solicitor includes:

- Authorization for the Mayor to enter into a 99-year lease and assent agreement with National Grid for the trail corridor:
- Authorization for the Mayor to convey a small land-locked parcel in the middle of the substation to National Grid;
- Dedication of the City owned property along the corridor to trail use;
- An order of taking for Joppa Park to establish a clear title and deed;
- Orders of taking for various temporary and permanent easements which have been donated by landowners;
- Authorizations to enter into temporary and/or permanent easement agreements with the American Yacht Club, New England Development, Range Light Limited Partnership, Salem Five Mortgage Company, the Newburyport Redevelopment Authority, and the Waterfront Trust;
- Authorization for the Mayor to swap land with property owner David Clarridge in order to widen the trail corridor along a narrow stretch;
- Authorization for the Mayor to accept a joint interest in Town of Newbury owned land;
- Authorization for the Mayor to grant a lease amendment to the American Yacht Club.

The right-of-way requirements for Phase II of the Rail Trail project along the former City Branch rail corridor have been considerably more demanding than for Phase I along the old Eastern Line rail corridor eight years ago. Securing the legal right-of-way for Phase I involved years of effort and expense, but the corridor consists only of land owned by the MBTA as well as some City and state land and three other landowners. The City Branch corridor of Phase II, however, has been broken up

by the B&M Railroad's sale of a number of parcels, and is physically narrower in places – it consists of land owned by multiple entities including National Grid, the U.S. Coast Guard, Salem Five Mortgage Company, New England Development, the Newburyport Redevelopment Authority, the Waterfront Trust, as well as the City the Town of Newbury. Retaining walls, fences, drainage structures and sidewalks affect a number of other landowners. The overall right-of-way involves about two dozen landowners and approximately 80 parcels.

In addition, MassDOT and FHWA have grown increasingly exacting in recent years regarding new right-of-way requirements, such as temporary easements for work along property lines, specific dedication of the use of public land, etc. While the City negotiated a 99-year license with National Grid in 2003 for the trail corridor, MassDOT and FHWA determined that we have to re-negotiate a 99year lease with the utility. While the City and the Town of Newbury acquired land from B&M Railroad in 2006, MassDOT is now requiring dedication of the municipal land. While the City secured a permanent trail easement from Norbert Carey in 2010 on land he bought from B&M Railroad, MassDOT is requiring a revised easement with the current owner in order to incorporate work on retaining walls along the edges as well as an electrical easement. While the City secured permanent easements in 1999 on land now owned by New England Development, the easements need to be renegotiated regarding width, alignment, and construction access. Finally, MassDOT is requiring the City to secure temporary and permanent easements from a number of owners for work along property lines such as fencing, retaining walls, drainage structures, and sidewalks which was not required a few years ago. This complexity has required the investment of a considerable amount of staff, consultant, and legal services time and money. However, this investment is a necessary prerequisite for leveraging the \$4 million in federal and state construction funding.

The "shovel-ready" package of plans and specifications is due to MassDOT by August 1st in preparation for an August 15, 2015 advertising date. The right-of-way must be certified by the City Solicitor this July. Construction funding for the project (80% federal and 20% state) is programmed in the Merrimack Valley Metropolitan Planning Organization's FFY2015-2018 regional Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP). While the project is scheduled to be advertised this FFY, it is likely that bids will be received and a contractor selected and mobilized in the spring of 2016.

Phase II of the Clipper City Rail Trail is a high priority for the City. Securing the legal right-of-way to meet MassDOT and FHWA requirements is one of the critical final elements in ensuring and leveraging the federal and state construction funding. Thank you for your consideration.

- 3. That portion of property known as the "City Branch Rail Corridor" acquired by the City from Boston and Maine Corporation by deed dated June 27, 2006 and recorded with the Essex South District Registry of Deeds in Book 25956, Page 191 currently held for general municipal purposes;
- 4. That portion of property known and numbered 115 Water Street" acquired by the City pursuant to an Order of Taking dated September 28, 2009 and filed with the Essex South District Division of Land Court as Document No. 5033345 and withdrawn from the jurisdiction of said Land Court by instrument dated July 27, 2012 and recorded with said Registry of Deeds in Book 31586, Page 329 currently held for sewer, access and utility purposes; and
- 5. That 28,560 s/f +/- parcel of land known as "Joppa Park" which is subject to an Order of Taking voted on as of the date hereof and more particularly described in as Parcel 44-AT-1 and 44-C-9 on page 9 or 17 on a plan entitled "Newburyport/Newbury Clipper City Rail; Trail- Phase 2, Preliminary Right of Way Property Plans, Sheet 13 of 17" dated ________; and


We are writing to respectfully request that the City Council approve allocation of \$18,000 from Free Cash to support completing design of the Harbormaster/Visiting Boater Facility project as well as anticipated construction administration. To date, design for this project has been supported by \$140,375 from boaters' fees. We are currently at 75% design, and additional funding is needed to complete the design including the waterfront bathrooms for the general public as well as the adjacent plaza for the public. (Please see the attached aerial photo for the site, as well as renderings and a spreadsheet.) The additional design funding is needed now so that we can stay on track to complete design and permitting by the end of May 2015 so the project can be bid in June for construction starting this fall in September 2015.

The City has been working for over a year on design and permitting of the project with the design team of Keery Design and Olson Lewis + Architects plus various sub-consultants. In addition to the project kick-off meeting for the general public, there have been over a dozen public meetings through the Harbor Commission, Waterfront Trust, Redevelopment Authority, and Conservation Commission as the design has been developed for the project. Located on the Fish Pier, the building will be approximately 1,736 square feet. One side will include customer service, reception, and meeting space, as well as administrative office, staff lockers, and storage space. The other side, connected by a breezeway, will provide bathrooms for the general public plus showers and laundry facilities for visiting boaters. There will also be a small second floor office for the Harbormaster. The structure will be raised approximately three feet above grade in order to accommodate storm surges and meet floodplain code requirements. In addition, there will be an adjacent outdoor brick plaza centered on the relocated fishermen's monument with picnic tables, benches and landscaping.


Last fall, the City applied in partnership with the Commonwealth's Division of Marine Fisheries for a nationally competitive federal Boating Infrastructure Grant of \$448,000 from the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service to support the visiting boater aspect of the project. At the beginning of the month, we were informally given the positive news that we can use that grant figure for planning purposes as we await the formal award letter. The design team is currently working on the 75% cost estimate, which is anticipated to be approximately \$1,475,000. The project's design costs, including the requested additional design funding, will continue to be at the low end of the 10-15% of construction cost that is typical for such projects. Thank you for your consideration.



Annual Audit of the City's FY 2014 Financial Statements

The certified public accounting firm of Melanson, Heath & Company has completed the annual audit of the City's FY 2014 financial statements. This audit must be performed by an independent CPA firm and is required by bond rating agencies, financial institutions, and various state and federal government entities. A copy of the audit is on file in the City Clerk's Office for your review.

The audit was conducted in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States and standards applicable to financial audits contained in the publication, Government Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. These standards require that the audit be performed to obtain a reasonable assurance that the City's financial statements are free of material misstatements. In addition, the audit assesses the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by City management.

The audit indicates that the City's Financial Statements and Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards, as required by OMB Circular A-133, are presented fairly, in all material respects, and are in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

The audit also includes a management report that contains recommendations for strengthening internal controls and operating efficiency. This is the second consecutive year that no new audit findings or recommendations for improvements were noted for FY2014 operations. This is a major accomplishment for the City and an indication that current financial management practices are working effectively.

However, while there were no recommendations made for the current fiscal year, Melanson, Heath & Company did provide a follow-up on prior year recommendations, the most notable being an improvement to the cash reconciliation process, which continues to be a material weakness within the Treasurer's office. As a result, the City is actively

working to address this recommendation during fiscal year 2015. Current year action steps include: 1) daily reconciliations between the Treasurer's and Auditor's offices to ensure consistency between the bank statements, cash book and general ledger, 2) researching and addressing all prior year and current year reconciling items as identified on the bank-to-book reconciliations, and 3) updating the City's cash receipts policy to ensure that all departments are providing timely and accurate turnovers of receipts.

In addition to addressing the cash reconciliation process, the outside auditors have made recommendations carried over from the prior year audit, which are not listed as material weaknesses, but suggestions for improving overall financial operations within the City. Many of these are currently being implemented and are detailed in the full management report available in the City Clerk's Office.

As you may be aware, the City established a Financial Policies and Procedures manual and continues to adapt the document to address many of the recommendations contained in the report. Additionally, given the inclusion of the Newburyport Contributory Retirement System as part of the City's annual audit, Melanson, Heath & Company was able to issue an unqualified or "clean" opinion of the City's FY2014 financial statements for the second year in a row.

PART 2 Article III CHAPTER 3-31: Feeding or baiting migratory waterfowl or sea birds Short Title: Feeding or baiting wild birds Balling and the Company of the Compa

3-32 Purpose and intent

The presence of migratory shorebirds such as ducks, swans, geese as well as seagulls are part of the fabric of a costal and riverfront community. These birds in essence bring to Newburyport's public and private waterfront and parks a connection with the Merrimack River and the Atlantic Ocean. An unfortunate by-product of these birds' presence is the inappropriate and harmful practice of human feeding of these birds. This feeding contributes to this wildlife becoming dependent on human intervention. It exposes them to predators and leaves behind bird waste that negatively affects the ecosystem. Therefore, the intent is to minimize migratory waterfowl and seabird exposure to human feeding and in the reduction of animal waste within the City of Newburyport.

3-33 Definitions

- (a) "Migratory Waterfowl", ducks, geese, swans, of the Anatidae family and any subspecies of said family.
- "Seabirds", seagulls and any subspecies of seagulls (b)
- "Director", the Director of Massachusetts Division of Fisheries and (c) Wildlife, agents or designees as authorized pursuant to Chapter 131 of the Massachusetts General Laws.
- "Feeding or Baiting", shall mean the placing, exposing, depositing, (d) distribution, or scattering, directly or indirectly of shelled, shucked, or unshucked corn, wheat, other grain, bread, salt, or any other feed or nutritive substance in any manner of form so as to constitute feeding or baiting within the City of Newburyport.

3-34 Limitations

- (a) No person, except the Director, as defined in 3-33 of this ordinance shall feed or bait any migratory waterfowl at any location within the City of Newburyport including all water bodies therein.
- (b) Nothing in this section shall be constituted to limit the feeding of domesticated waterfowl as defined by the Division of Fisheries and Wildlife, by a farmer as defined

in Section 1A of Chapter 128 on property owned or leased by him, or the feeding of waterfowl or other birds by propagators licensed under Section 23 of Chapter 131of the General Laws when such waterfowl or other birds are confined in such a manner as may be required to said Section 23 and by Rules and Regulations issued under authority thereof, or the feeding by any person or his agents, invites or licensees of waterfowl lawfully kept as a pet by that person.

(c) Notwithstanding any of the above, the Director may authorize the emergency feeding of waterfowl and other birds when, in his opinion, such action is necessary in order to alleviate undue losses and suffering of birds due to unusual weather conditions and other circumstances. The Director may authorize such action by such means as he deems necessary and expedient, but such means shall include the immediate

notification of the Newburyport City Clerk by first-class mail

13-101 Enforcement

(a) "Enforcement Agents" This section may be enforced by the City of Newburyport animal Control Officer, agents of the Newburyport Board of Health, Newburyport Police Officers, Code Enforcement Officers, Commonwealth of Massachusetts Environmental Police Officers, and any other enforcement officers of the Division of (Massachusetts) Law Enforcement.

(b) "Violation" Any person who violates any provision of this section shall be subject to a warning for the first offense and a fine of \$25.00 for each subsequent offense thereafter. In lieu of enforcement through criminal proceedings, an enforcing agent may enforce this section by non-criminal disposition in accordance with

Massachusetts general Laws Chapter 40 Section 21D,

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(c) While the posting of signage delineating this ordinance is encouraged in areas where both people and migratory waterfowl gather, signs need not be present to enforce this ordinance.




- (a) "Procedure" All road racing, walkathon, bicycle, or swimming events shall, through that event's organizer, board of directors, charity foundation or designee apply for authorization to hold the event through the Office of the City Clerk. The City Clerk upon review of the completed form will place the application on the regular City Council agenda. Upon following the procedures of the Council, as deemed appropriated in the sole judgment of the Council, the application will be considered approved if the Council votes favorably by majority. The event will name one person responsible on the application and shall provide contact information to include name, address and telephone number.
- (b) "Exemptions" Each event organizer or organization shall comply with this ordinance and no exemptions will be permitted.
- (c) "Course map", All applications shall be accompanied by a course map showing the event route, water stops, refreshment stops, and so-called "porta-potties". The course map shall also include any road closures, detours and parking areas. The course map shall be approved by Police, Fire, Department of Public Services, Parks Commission and Harbormasters Departments prior to submission to the City Clerk.
- (d) "Electronic Amplifier" Electronic amplifiers, loudspeakers and builhorn use shall be requested at time of application. Under no circumstances will they be used for public address announcements or music before 8:00 A.M. except for Sundays when electronic amplifiers, loud speakers or builhorns will be used for public address announcements or music before 9:00 AM. This shall be deemed a requirement for all permitted events regardless of type or location.
- (e) "Road Closure" No ways, public or private, boat ramps or parking lots controlled or patrolled by the city shall be closed without authorization. Authorization shall be considered granted only if said closure(s) are contained in the approved permit. It is the sole responsibility of the race organizers to notify residents ten (10) days in advance that neighborhood roads will be closed if no alternate route is available to those residents.

- (f) "Insurance" All events shall have an insurance policy or rider in effect for the event naming the "City of Newburyport" as an insured. The policy shall be no less than two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00).
- (g) "Event termination" If in the judgment of the City Marshal, Fire Chief or Department of Public Services (DPS) Director or designees thereof determine that an event is unsafe due to existing conditions, that event may be stopped, terminated or suspended. In the case of a multidiscipline event such as a triathlon, the Harbormaster or his/her designee may likewise stop, terminate or suspend the swimming portion for cause.
- (h) "Event and traffic Security" The City Marshal, Fire Chief, DPS Director or in the case of a triathlon, the Harbormaster can require special duty personnel to oversee the safety and security of the event. All special duty assignments will be paid by the event organizers.
- (i) "Clean-up" The event organizers shall be responsible for post event trash collection, removal of signage, directional arrows, advertisements or other promotional material associated with the event.

13-101 Enforcement

- (a) "Regulations" Consistent with this ordinance, the city shall promulgate regulations to enforce and otherwise implement the provisions of this ordinance upon passage by the City Council. Any event previously approved by City Council shall be deemed permitted.
- (b) "Warning" In the circumstance that this ordinance is violated, the enforcement may consist of a warning. Any warnings issued for violation(s) will be reported to the City Clerk and City Council and may be used as a factor in future application approvals and denials.
- (c) "Noncriminal Disposition" If the city determines that a violation has occurred in which a noncriminal violation is issued, the named event organizer shall be penalized by a non-criminal disposition as provided bin Massachusetts General Law as adopted by the City of Newburyport as a general ordinance in Subsection 1-17 of Chapter 1 of the Code or Ordinances of the City of Newburyport in the amounts set herein in 13-101(d)
- (d) "Violation" The non-criminal violation shall be \$100.00 for the first offense and \$250.00 for second and subsequent offenses. Any non-criminal citations issued for violation(s) will be reported to the City Clerk and City Council and shall be used as a factor in future application approvals and denials.
