The applicant provided the information on the storage of the floats the Commission members requested at that meeting. Steve Moore moved to close the public hearing. Doug Muir seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Lisë Reid, Newburyport Parks Department

40 Low Street Notice of Intent DEP File #051-1025

Chris Huntress of Huntress Associates described the plans to expand the parking area at the track. He said the reorganization of the arrival area would make the parking at the track safer and more efficient. The plans have been revised as requested by the City Engineer. No significant comments were made by the peer reviewer. The drainage swale on Low Street is not jurisdictional. The Commission members requested that the applicant add a fence to keep vehicles out of the no-disturb zone. They also asked if the proposed rain garden could be enlarged. Mr. Huntress responded that it is sized appropriately for the wetland but additional plantings could be added.

A request for a variance was submitted because the work would intrude into the 25-foot no-disturb zone. Mr. Huntress said the improvement in safety would provide the overriding public benefit required for the variance. The applicant had not yet provided the required findings for the variance. Steve Moore moved to continue the public hearing to the March 3 meeting. Doug Muir seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Tom Hughes and David Keery represented the applicant, who is proposing to expand an existing single-family home and construct a new deck. The addition and deck would be located in an area that is currently landscaped. The work is not within the 25-foot no-disturb zone but this area would be impacted by vehicles and equipment during the construction process. The Commission members requested that applicant replace the two mature deciduous trees near the

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addition that are to be removed. Steve Moore moved to close the public hearing. Doug Muir seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

The applicant is proposing to expand a first-floor deck. He has not yet submitted a plan for the replacement of the beach grass that would be impacted. The grass could be moved to sparsely vegetated areas on the site. The Commission members will visit the site to assess the situation. They requested that the applicant submit a written opinion on the suitability of the diamond piers that are proposed for the two new deck posts. The applicant was reminded that the deck must be two feet above grade at a minimum. Doug Muir moved to continue the public hearing to the March 3 meeting. Dan Warchol seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Doug Muir moved to issue an Order of Condition with the special conditions that: 1) during the winter the proposed floats shall be stored at a distance greater than 25 feet from any bordering vegetated wetland areas on the site and shall be stored within an existing developed or landscaped area; 2) any additional modification to the work proposed shall be reviewed and approved by the Commission prior to start of work and 3) the following conditions requested by the Division of Marine Fisheries shall also be included: a) this authorization is for the dock system shown on the plans as using a flexible, low-impact mooring system, specifically, the use of a 1 ¹/₄" diameter galvanized steel eye bolt (12" long), driven into the river bottom bedrock with a rode system that will ensure that the mooring ropes or chains do not contact the bottom of the river during all water elevations and replacement of these systems with a conventional anchorage is not permitted without written authorization from the Division of Fisheries and Wildlife regarding impacts to Resource Area habitat of state-listed wildlife and the MA Endangered Species Act; b) the drilling equipment used to install the eye-bolts into the bedrock shall not utilize a hammering action and c) when filing for any renewal, extension or amendment to this OOC, the applicant shall contact the Division of Fisheries and Wildlife for written response regarding impacts to Resource Area habitat of state-listed species. Paul Healy seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Doug Muir moved to issue an Order of Conditions with the specials conditions that: 1) two trees with a minimum 2-inch caliper shall be planted to replace the two mature deciduous trees near the addition that are to be removed and the Conservation Administrator shall approve the location and species of these trees: 2) construction fencing shall be installed behind the silt sock and 3) the 25-foot no-disturb zone shall be restored after construction. Paul Healy seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.
