1. Call to Order

Chair Joe Teixeira called a meeting of the Newburyport Conservation Commission to order at 6:45 p.m.

2. Roll Call

Tom Hughes represented the applicant. According to note #9 on the plans, all areas outside the building envelope and driveway shall be vegetated upon completion of construction. This would result in a shortage of 335 square feet of vegetation. Mr. Hughes proposed to plant 400 square feet of beach grass under the deck. He said if 335 square feet of this does not survive, the next step would be to remove pavement. The pavement would be removed from one side of the right of way and added to the other, where currently no vegetation exists, which would require

the involvement of the City. The Commission members were concerned about the complexity this would add to the permitting process. It was decided instead the shrub line would be extended 10-15 feet and the existing woody vegetation supplemented. Siding under the house would extend to 2.2 feet above grade and the area under the decks would remain open. The applicant must depict the expanded planting area on the plan and must include a fence that would delineate the limit of disturbance. The applicant also must submit a plan showing the limits of work, a construction staging plan and a sequencing plan. Dan Bourdeau to continue the public hearing to the April 4 meeting. Paul Healy seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously

Dan Bourdeau moved to to close the public hearing portion of the meeting. Doug Muir seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.
