## 1. Call to Order

# 4. Harbormaster's Report

Paul Hogg reported that:

• he took five members of the Army Corp of Engineers out on the river. He focused their attention on the mouth of the river and discussed safety issues. He also pointed out the area where he thinks dredging should take place.

• the work to repair the north jetty will be put out to bid next month. A 120-foot extension of the south jetty will be included in the bid package.

• work on the Whittier Bridge has been progressing well. He has been conducting manoverboard and boating safety trainings because his boats will not be at the work site after Columbus Day. Mass DOT has been pleased with the presence of the Harbormaster's department at the work site. Because the project is behind schedule, the existing bridge might be taken down into the water to save time.

- SPS has been continuing with work in the embayment.
- the docks are be taken out of the water on October 23 and 24.
- work on the Cashman Park fish pier will be put out to bid in November or December, with construction expected to begin in the early spring.

• the Salisbury Harbor Commission agreed to contribute \$2,500 towards the new pump for the pump-out station, half of the amount that remained after a State grant covered 75% of the cost.
