



ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

This two story house with pitched roof and three bay facade is vernacular in style and probably dates from the early nineteenth century. The architectural detail in this building was probably concentrated in the front entrance. The original doorway has been altered and is presently flanked by Victorian brackets.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

The original owner of this house has yet to be documented. In 1851 the property was owned by Mrs. Elizabeth Page, a nurse. Henry Page, a house carpenter, lived in the next house on Dove Street. It is quite possible that Mrs. Page was his mother and he may have built this house.
