

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

This two story house with pitched roof and symmetrical, five bay facade is vernacular in style with several features of the Greek Revival style. Noteworthy features include the shallow pediments in the window lintels of the first story, the bold fascia in the cornice and the cornerboards. The front entrance is typically Greek Revival in style. The door is flanked by sidelights and bold pilasters, supporting a heavy entablature above.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

In 1851 Henry Page, a house carpenter, was the owner of this house. Page might have been the builder and original owner of the house.

Prior to 1872 Charles Johnson purchased this property. Johnson is listed as a painter in the City Directory for 1871.

In 1905 Frank J. Boyles sold this house to Catherine Crimmins. The house remained in the Crimmins family until 1949.
