REMOTE LEARNING CENTER

During COVID, we worked hard to meet the need of families with remote schooling and a lack of supervision for their children.

We had over 45 families participate. Provided \$36,600 in scholarships \$112, 620 in revenue -\$65,764 in expenses

\$46,855 profit (made up for loss from summer programs)







Prevention Grants

Tower Fund (5 years) will end June 2022 \$125k/ year for regional youth development initiatives

BSAS City was just awarded a \$125k BSAS "Mass Call Grant" (2 years, plus two 3 year extensions) for regional prevention/ services and supports

DFC Our Associate Director of Regional Prevention is assisting with oversight of Amesbury's Drug Free Communities grant and receiving 10% of pay from Amesbury FY 21, FY22, FY23





Return on Investment FY21

- For every \$1 of tax money spent NYS generated nearly \$2.00 worth of services and supports for children and families.
- An additional Tower 3 year grant at \$125k/year, brings the ROI to almost \$2.50 for every \$1 of city funds for FY18.
- NYS also plans to fund 30 part time or seasonal positions paid for with Revolving Funds.

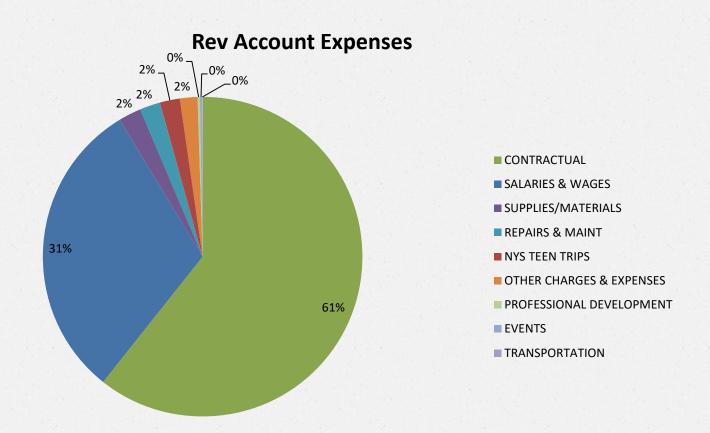

Expense Breakdown FY21



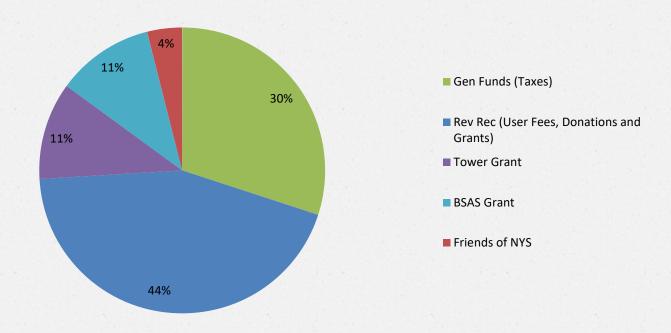






Revenue Sources

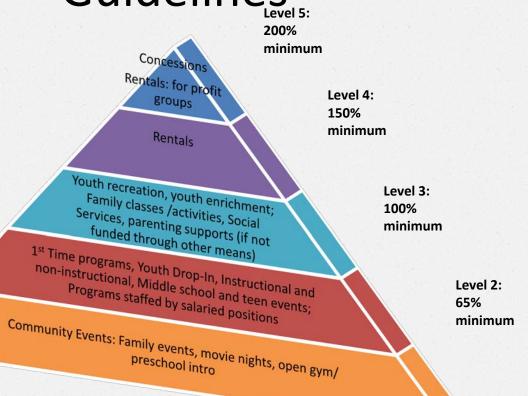
