1. Call to Order

Acting Chair Paul Healy called a meeting of the Newburyport Conservation Commission to order at 6:46 p.m.

Andy Port described the plans to plant grass in the areas of the central waterfront parking lots from which spaces are to be removed. A 6" layer of loam would be installed and it would not be necessary to disturb the existing soil. The edges of the area would taper down to meet the

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existing conditions. The Commission members were concerned about the soil washing away before the grass has become established. Dan Bourdeau moved to issue a Negative 3 Determination with the condition that erosion control shall be placed around the perimeter of the work areas. Dan Warchol seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.
