

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

This house is vernacular-Georgian in style. The two story form with pitched roof and a symmetrical three bay facade is representative of many of the homes built in Newburyport during the eighteenth century. The front entrance of this house has been altered and it retains little of its original character. This house is in the process of being rehabilitated by the present owner. The window sash dates from this period of rehabilitation.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

The early owners of this house have yet to be documented. According to the 1851 Map of Newburyport, the property was owned by Mrs. Mary H. Dame. Mrs. Dame was a nurse. She sold the property prior to 1872.
