ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

This two story house with pitched roof and symmetrical five bay facade probably dates from the eighteenth century. The placement of the chimneys indicate that this building may have an earliet core. The front entrance located in the central bay has been altered and presently has the sidelights and pilasters characteristic of the early nineteenth century.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

The early owners of this house have yet to be documented. The earliest known owner is Helen C. Moseley, owner in 1924. Later the house's owner was Eunice Smith who sold the property to George Barker in 1941. In 1953 the house was conveyed to Walter Rogers.
