

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

This house is an excellent example of the Federal style that was so popular in Newburyport during the early years of the nineteenth century. The three story form with hipped roof and decreasing window size in the upper floors is typically Federal. The classically inspired window lintels are worthy of note as are the trabeated doorways one of which has sidelights flanking the door and a fanlight with tracery above.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

Although this building was probably built just after the turn of the nineteenth century, the earliest known owners were the Pearson family, proprietor of the house during the second half of the nineteenth century. In 1872 the property was owned by J. Gilman Pearson. Pearson was a farmer. This house remained in the Gilman family until the early twentieth century. In 1915 Edwin Pearson sold the property to Mildred Pearson.
