ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

This two and a half story house with mansard roof was probably built about 1865. The building has suffered several alterations. Interesting features remaining from the original period of construction include the slate roof with its polychomy. The front entrance portico is Georgian in style and was probably added at a later date.

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HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

In 1872 it appears that this property was owned by Henry W. Moulton. Moulton was a prominent citizen in the community. In 1857 he was one of the incorporators of the Mechanic Library Association, for the purpose of "promoting useful knowledge and more especially for the instruction and improvement of young men engaged in mechanical pursuits." In 1865 Moulton served as a representative to the General Court of the State of Massachusetts.

This property was sold to Daniel T. Fish in 1872. His heirs subsequently sold it to Mary T. Savage in 1906.
