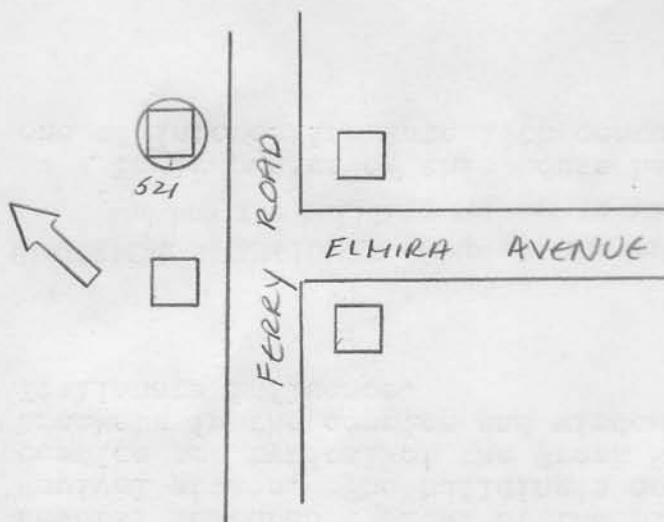

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

This two story building with pitched roof was probably built in the mid-19th century. Although this house is vernacular in style, it has several features typical of the mid 19th century - Italianate and Greek Revival styles. The building's cornerboards and the wide fascia in the cornice are typical of the Greek Revival style. The cut-out scrolled brackets in the cornice and window lintels were undoubtedly the results of Italianate influence.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

Early owners of this house have yet to be documented. The house is one of interesting late 19th century buildings on the outskirts of the City.
