

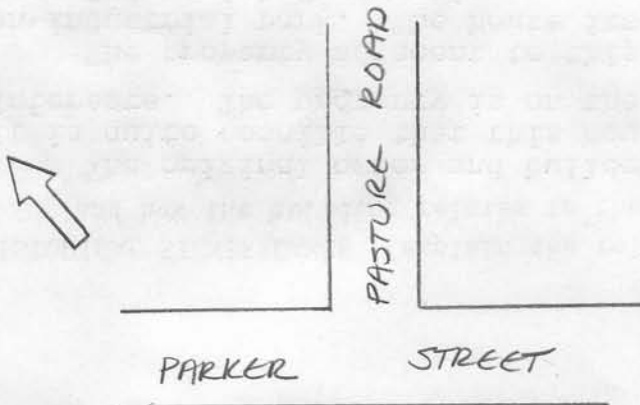

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

Architecturally, this house has many elements that were typical of the homes built in Newburyport during the third quarter of the eighteenth century. The overall form of the house, two stories in height with pitched roof and symmetrical five bay facade, is characteristic of Georgian homes. The entrance porch resembling a classical temple in miniature, is also characteristic of the style.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

The original owner and builder of this house has yet to be documented. It is quite possible that this house was the home of one with agrarian interests. The property is on the outskirts of the city.

The property adjacent to this building is presently being developed as an industrial park. The house itself is presently owned by the Newburyport Area Industrial Corporation.
