General principles of the HRC discussed with our new student members:

Iftar Debrief:

Panel had great energy. People were very pleased with the panel and the event. This was our 2nd Community Iftar. Community response was very favorable. Disappointed that the Daily News did not write a story about the event. Photos were published. A Letter to the Editor about the event was submitted by the HRC and was printed.

Panel was very diverse and enjoyed participating. Panel ranged from a High School student to individuals that emigrated from places like Kazakhstan and Lebanon. All the panelists expressed great pride in being Americans as well as Muslims.

Donation of \$500 from ICB Wayland helped fund the food and beverages. Remainder will be submitted to Friends for Peace.

Know Your Neighbor

Looking towards the Fall, we would like to tape at Market Basket and Kelleher Park. We would also like to do a session with city officials at City Hall.

Pride:

Next year hope to have a Pride Fest in Newburyport. Would like it to be a large community event, perhaps in partnership with the Firehouse.

Focus theme for June 22 Know Your Neighbor will highlight Pride Month and LGBT Awareness. We will have some rainbow balloons and some other décor to highlight this focus. Participants will hopefully be comfortable speaking about LGBT issues. Hope is to make people comfortable by encouraging safe topics like talking about LGBT friends, relatives, neighbors. Other topics could include what Pride Month means to an individual.

Gun Violence Film Project – K Preftes will be meeting with the firehouse this week to discuss this further

Student Subcommittee – mentorship program will hopefully begin in the Fall.

Update on Homelessness issues. P. Blaiwas attended some meetings regarding homeless shelters in area and other issues regarding homelessness. Not surprisingly, the solution is not deemed to be more shelters, but in working to provide long term housing for individuals who are homeless. This could be by means of rental assistance, subsidized rents with subsequent increase to market rate, etc.

FY 2018 Wrap up.

All felt we had a very good year. We had many great and powerful events (Peace Prize, Iftar, Holocaust remembrance series). Started partnerships with many great organizations (ICB Wayland, Firehouse).
