#### **NRC Mission Statement**

## 1. Previous Meeting Action Points

- 1.1 Comparison of sea levels used in the PI MVP project and the levels used in the Resiliency Plan Jon Eric White 2 June deferred Jon-Eric absent
- 1.2 A project to cover the completion of berms to protect the WWTF has been put into the City capital Investment Plan COMPLETE.
- 1.3 Review National Grid infrastructure change documentation. To be addressed at the 16 June meeting. Jon Eric White 16 June deferred Jon-Eric absent
- 1.4 The permanent Resiliency Committee city employee members were confirmed as: Andrew Port, Julia Godtfredsen, Molly Ettenborough, and Jon-Eric White. Other city employees can be called on as resources.

## 2. Newbury/Newburyport PI MVP Project

Andy Port reported that two public meetings covering sea level rise impacts and an economic analysis held and were recorded. The project consultants will maintain website for the rest of the year. NBPT will migrate materials to city website.

The two public meeting recordings are already posted on city website. The expectation is that the report will be issued in July complete with the maps and financial analysis. The Plum island access road will be highlighted as the primary issues. An estimate of cost to raise the access road was not developed and a guesstimate for the cost was used.

Rishi Nandi has been a member of the project steering group. His view was that the study provides a high level assessment of the budgetary challenge. No one has engineered a solution for the road improvements, so no real cost estimates. The benefit of the report is that it can be used as a framework for approaching other city infrastructure projects.

Report findings will likely argue that more funding is needed to provide a more detailed analysis of PI turnpike costs. The raising of the access road faces issues over and above the cost such as the environmental impact and the accessibility to Plum Island during construction.

It was agreed that there is a continuing need to coordinate between Newbury and Newburyport on PI issues. Plum Island has a very active and effective lobbying group (MRBA) that concentrate on short-term protection. The MRBA is run very well by State senator Tarr.

On longer term approaches as detailed in the Resiliency plan there needs to be a more regular connection with Newbury. During the development of the plan Newbury had a representative on our resiliency committee and we had members who attended their equivalent. It was discussed that a new PI working group be established with membership being drawn from members with appropriate experience and skill sets. It was noted that the intermunicipal agreement between the City and Newbury is due to be updated in 2025.

Andy will follow up with the Mayor for guidance on setting up a PI Group. Andy Port July 14

Rishi Nandi incumbent on the PI project committee outlined some next steps and how to move the recommendations of the study further. The discussion included the following points:

- Establishing a joint sub committee for zoning on Plum Island as there are disconnects between the two administrations
- Strengthen our connections with other partners such as The Wildlife Refuge and the Audubon.
   Federal funds maybe available for access improvements through the refuge and the Audubon has work going on regarding the health of the marsh. Plum Island is a regional asset not just for commercial and homeowner's interests.
- Need to review the Newburyport side of the turnpike for flooding issues and seek hydrological studies.
- Need to understand all available funding sources which may require consulting support.
- Need to assess RMAT standards
- Need to assess what coverage do we have for storm damage to Plum Island. There is the sewer
  and water settlement fund but it is limited and is getting used already.

It was agreed that a review of RMAT standards would be on the agenda possibly at the next meeting or the one after that. Rishi Nandi July 21 or August 18.

#### 3. Update on Multi Hazard Mitigation Planning

Julia Godtfredsen updated the committee regarding the update of the Multi Hazard Mitigation Plan. A small team had a meeting to plan the updating process with initial updates targeted for June 4<sup>th</sup>. Comments have been received from most members of the subcommittee. All of the Resiliency Plan actions have been formatted in an excel spreadsheet consistent with the MHMP format and the wording of each action is exactly the same as in the resiliency plan. It is expected that the MHMP will remain as the holding point for the Resiliency Plan actions. The spreadsheet version can be the basis for the Resiliency Committee to track progress.

Julia was asked to consider how to include the existing MHMP action points. This could be in the same table as the resiliency plan actions or in a separate table.

The excel spreadsheet will be circulated to the resiliency committee members. A first stab at responsibilities has been made to prompt discussion. David put down a first stab at responsible person for each action. The DRAFT spreadsheet will be circulated so that the responsibility discussion can begin. **David Chatfield June 18.** 

Volunteers are asked to express an interest in volunteering to support specific action points. It was agreed that the volunteer names would not be added to the document for the MHMP update but would be kept in the Resiliency committee version of the spreadsheet. Volunteers to express interest in supporting specific actions. **Volunteers July 14** 

An exact timeframe has not yet been established with Jennifer Hughes the consultant assisting us with this project on when she needs it.
