Limitations

- (a) "Procedure" All road racing, walkathon, bicycle, or swimming events shall, through that event's organizer, board of directors, charity foundation or designee apply for authorization to hold the event through the Office of the City Clerk. The City Clerk upon review of the completed form will place the application on the regular City Council agenda. Upon following the procedures of the Council, as deemed appropriated in the sole judgment of the Council, the application will be considered approved if the Council votes favorably by majority. The event will name one person responsible on the application and shall provide contact information to include name, address and telephone number.
- (b) "Exemptions" Each event organizer or organization shall comply with this ordinance and no exemptions will be permitted.
- (c) "Course map", All applications shall be accompanied by a course map showing the event route, water stops, refreshment stops, and so-called "porta-potties". The course map shall also include any road closures, detours and parking areas. The course map shall be approved by Police, Fire, Department of Public Services, Parks Commission and Harbormasters Departments prior to submission to the City Clerk.
- (d) "Electronic Amplifier" Electronic amplifiers, loudspeakers and bullhorn use shall be requested at time of application. Under no circumstances will they be used for public address announcements or music before 8:00 A.M. except for Sundays when electronic amplifiers, loud speakers or bullhorns will be used for public address announcements or music before 9:00 AM. This shall be deemed a requirement for all permitted events regardless of type or location.

- (g) "Event termination" If in the judgment of the City Marshal, Fire Chief or Department of Public Services (DPS) Director or designees thereof determine that an event is unsafe due to existing conditions, that event may be stopped, terminated or suspended. In the case of a multidiscipline event such as a triathlon, the Harbormaster or his/her designee may likewise stop, terminate or suspend the swimming portion for cause.
- (h) "Event and traffic Security" The City Marshal, Fire Chief, DPS Director or in the case of a triathlon, the Harbormaster can require special duty personnel to oversee the safety and security of the event. All special duty assignments will be paid by the event organizers.
- (i) "Clean-up" The event organizers shall be responsible for post event trash collection, removal of signage, directional arrows, advertisements or other promotional material associated with the event.





Any non-criminal citations issued for violation(s) will be reported to the City Clerk and City Council and shall be used as a factor in future application approvals and denials.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 12 -- STREETS, SIDEWALKS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Newburyport as follows:

Chapter 12 Streets, Sidewalks and Other Public Places

Article 1 In General

Sec. 12-1.5. - Signage, merchandising and beautification on public ways.

- (a) One (1) A-frame sign is allowed on public ways for each public entrance to a lawfully occupied commercial building, and, in addition one (1) display of merchandise is allowed on public ways solely for the primary public entrance to a lawfully occupied commercial building, and, in all cases, subject to the standards and criteria herein.
- (b) All A-frame signs shall be placed on the sidewalk directly adjacent to its related building. No A-frame sign shall exceed two (2) feet in width or depth, or four (4) feet in height, nor shall it cover more than four (4) square feet of the sidewalk, measured from any height of such sign. No movable sign shall be attached, affixed, and otherwise secured to the ground, nor to any structure or fixture. The applicant for an A-frame sign under paragraph (f) of this section may petition the city council, by majority vote, for relief from any of these size, movability, and location requirements. In the event that any relief is granted by the City Council, such relief shall expire concurrent with the accompanying license as prescribed by 12-1.5 subsection (f) shown below. Such relief is subject to revocation by supermajority vote of the City Council, at its sole discretion, at any time.
- (c) All merchandise displays shall be placed on the sidewalk directly adjacent to its related building, parallel to and within one (1) foot of an exterior wall of such building, and with one end located no more than four (4) feet from its related primary public entrance. A merchandise display may be placed as multiple objects, or otherwise in segments or pieces, but in no event shall the total width permitted for each primary public entrance exceed eight (8) linear feet in the aggregate. No merchandise display shall extend from the exterior wall of its related building by more than four (4) feet into the public way (sidewalk), nor shall any merchandise display exceed five (5) feet in height above the grade of such sidewalk. No merchandise display shall be attached, affixed, and otherwise secured to the ground, nor to any structure or fixture. No merchandise display shall be located within fifteen (15) feet of the intersection of the sidewalk of two

streets. The owner of a proposed merchandise display may petition the city council, by majority vote, for relief from any of these size, movability, and location requirements. In the event that any relief is granted by the City Council, such relief shall expire on March 1st of the second calendar year following approval. Such relief is subject to revocation by supermajority vote of the City Council, at its sole discretion, at any time.

- (d) Notwithstanding section 12-4, a merchandise display may include tables and/or clothing racks, however, no merchandise display shall include any tent, stall, booth, or other structure unless such structure is itself merchandise displayed in accordance with this section, or a permit is granted subject to section 12-4.
- (e) Before placing any A-frame sign or merchandise display on a public sidewalk, the owner thereof shall file with the city clerk a release and agreement to hold the City of Newburyport harmless from any and all liability, together with evidence of liability insurance covering the A-frame sign and/or merchandise display, with a minimum limit of one million dollars (\$1,000,000), and naming the City of Newburyport as a co-insured entity. The applicant shall maintain such insurance in full force and effect at all times that the A-frame sign and/or merchandise display is in place.
- (f) To place an A-frame sign in a public way, the applicant shall first obtain a license, by submitting a written application to the city clerk as directed by that official, and pay a biennial licensing fee of one-hundred dollars (\$100.00) per A-frame sign.
- (g) Provided that the proposed A-frame sign complies with all provisions of this section, the city clerk shall approve each such license applied for a term not to exceed two (2) years from the date of approval. Each licensed A-frame sign shall display upon it the unique license number issued for it by the city clerk, and the date of expiration of the license.
- (h) Flower boxes, planters, or similar items to beautify (beautification items) may be placed on the public sidewalk directly adjacent to a lawfully occupied commercial building without the prior, written permission of the city council, provided, however, that that city council may order their removal at any time.
- (i) All A-frame signs, merchandise displays, and beautification items placed on a public sidewalk shall preserve a travel lane along such sidewalk that is at least five (5) feet in width, and shall allow for free and unobstructed passage of pedestrians.
- (j) Enforcement of paragraphs (a) through (i) of this section shall be the responsibility of a city employee designated in writing by the Mayor within the Downtown Overlay District, established under section XXVIII of the zoning ordinance, and of the department of public services for all other locations.
- (k) Any sign, merchandise display, or beautification item existing unlawfully within a public way shall constitute a trespass upon public property, and may be removed, without prior notice or compensation to its owner, by the city officer charged with enforcement under paragraph (j) of this section.
- (l) Each violation of paragraphs (a) through (i) of this section shall be punishable by a fine of one hundred dollars (\$100.00). Each such violation shall be deemed to constitute a separate offense on each day during which it exists after the giving of notice to the violator.

AN ORDER RELATING TO UPDATING EVENT RULES:

BE IT ORDERED, that:

The following updates shall be made to Section 13-97 of the Newburyport Municipal Code Sec. 13-97. - Road races, walkathons, bicycle and other multidisciplined events.

- (a) Short title. This section may be cited as the "road races, walkathons and bicycle events."
- (b) Purpose and intent. The use of city streets and sidewalks for the purpose of road races, walkathons or bicycle tours are positive events that promote exercise, general good health and Newburyport as a destination. These events do from time to time create hardships, impacting neighborhoods and traffic. To create a balance between conflicting interests, by safeguarding participants, residents, visitors and the City of Newburyport, this section will define and codify the procedure for the benefit of all.

(c) Definitions.

- (1) Road race. A competitive or non-competitive running event that utilizes the streets, sidewalks and/or crosses over streets or sidewalks within city limits and in which an entry fee is required or charitable donation is solicited or suggested.
- (2) Walkathon. A competitive or non-competitive walk event that utilizes the streets, sidewalks and/or crosses over streets or sidewalks within city limits and in which an entry fee is required or charitable donation is solicited or suggested.
- (3) Bicycle race. A competitive or non-competitive bicycling event that utilizes the streets, sidewalks and/or crosses over streets or sidewalks within city limits and in which an entry fee is required or charitable donation is solicited or suggested.
- (4) Multidisciplined event. A competitive or non-competitive event requiring or offering running, walking, biking, swimming or any combination thereof in which an entry fee is required or a charitable donation is solicited or suggested.
- (5) Event. Any road race, walkathon, bicycle race, multi-disciplined event as defined above.

(d) Limitations.

(1) Procedure. All events shall, through that event's organizer, board of directors, charity foundation or designee ("organizer") apply for city council authorization to hold the event through the office of the city clerk no later than sixty (60) days before the event's proposed date. There shall be a grace period through December 31, 2017, during which applications will be accepted beyond the prescribed due date. Prior to application with the city council, the event

shall file and receive approval from all applicable city departments, boards, and commissions. Copies of such approved applications, including along with documentation of any fees, donations, in-kind donations paid as part of said application(s), shall be included as part of the city council application.

The date of application is the date a completed application is submitted to the city clerk's office and stamped by the same. The city clerk, upon review of the completed form, will place the application on the next regular city council agenda, even if such submission is a late file. Upon following the procedures of the council, as deemed appropriated in the sole judgment of the council, the application will be considered approved if the council votes favorably by majority. The application shall name one (1) person responsible on the application and shall provide contact information to include name, address, email address, and telephone number.


- (2) Exemptions. Each event organizer or organization shall comply with this ordinance and no exemptions will be permitted.
- (3) Course map. All applications shall be accompanied by a legible, precise course map showing the event route, water stops, refreshment stops, and so-called "port-a-potties". The course map shall also include any road closures, detours and parking areas. The course map shall be approved by police, fire, department of public services, parks commission and harbormasters departments prior to submission to the city clerk.
- (4) Electronic amplifier. Electronic amplifiers, loudspeakers and bullhorn use shall be requested at time of application. Under no circumstances will they be used for public address announcements or music before 8:00 a.m., except for Sundays when electronic amplifiers, loud speakers or bullhorns will not be used for public address announcements or music before 9:00 a.m.
- (5) Road closure. No ways, public or private, boat ramps or parking lots controlled or patrolled by the city shall be closed without authorization. Authorization shall be considered granted only if said closure(s) are contained in the approved permit. It is the sole responsibility of the race organizers to notify residents fourteen (14) days in advance that neighborhood roads will be closed if no alternate route is available to those residents. Notification shall be made by race organizers by informational packet drop-off at all residences that may be impacted, including, but not limited to, road closures, restricted driveway access, parking restrictions, or noise. In the case of multi-family residences with so-called security doors, notification will be sufficient at said security door. A copy of the notification shall be provided to the city clerk and, when possible, posted on the city website and distributed via email. Further, a list of all streets notified shall be provided to the city clerk to be date stamped and appended to the application record. Press releases and other media type notifications are encouraged.
- (6) Insurance. All events shall have an insurance policy or rider in effect for the event naming the "City of Newburyport" as an additional insured. The policy shall be no less than two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00).
- (7) Event termination. If in the judgment of the city marshal, fire chief or department of public services (DPS) director or designees thereof determine that an event is unsafe due to existing conditions, that event may be stopped, terminated or suspended. In the case of a multidiscipline event such as a triathlon, the harbormaster or his/her designee may likewise stop, terminate or suspend the swimming portion for cause.
- (8) Event and traffic security. The city marshal, fire chief, DPS director or in the case of a triathlon, the harbormaster can require special duty personnel to assist in the organizing and coordinating the safety and security of the event. All special duty assignments will be paid by the event organizers.
- (9) Clean-up. The event organizers shall be responsible for post event trash collection, removal of signage, directional arrows, advertisements or other promotional material associated with the event.

- (10) Parking. The event organizers shall be responsible for including parking instructions in materials disseminated to event participants. If the event is happening within one-half mile of municipal parking, then participants shall be asked to park at such parking facilities.
- (11) Notification of previous event organizers. To the extent reasonably possible, the city clerk shall notify all event organizers from events held from 2014—2016, inclusive, by a one-time phone, email, or letter of the new application timeline and other requirements.
- (12) Simplification. Departments are encouraged to unify their respective applications into a singular application, managed and distributed by the city clerk's office.
- (13) Americans with Disabilities Act. Event organizers are reminded of the importance of and expectation of adherence to the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C § 12101) and subsequent applicable amendments.

(e) Enforcement.

- (1) Regulations. Consistent with this section, the city shall promulgate regulations to enforce and otherwise implement the provisions of this section upon passage by the city council. Any event previously approved by city council shall be deemed permitted.
- (2) Warning. In the circumstance that this section is violated, the enforcement may consist of a warning. Any warnings issued for violation(s) will be reported to the city clerk and city council and may be used as a factor in future application approvals and denials.
- (3) Noncriminal disposition. If the city determines that a violation has occurred in which a noncriminal violation is issued, the named event organizer shall be penalized by a non-criminal disposition as provided in Massachusetts General Law as adopted by the City of Newburyport as a general ordinance in section 1-17 of chapter 1 of the Code or Ordinances of the City of Newburyport in the amounts set herein in subsection (e)(4) below.
- (4) Violation. The non-criminal violation shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the first offense and two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) for second and subsequent offenses. Any non-criminal citations issued for violation(s) will be reported to the city clerk and city council and shall be used as a factor in future application approvals and denials.
- (5) Failure to notify. If the event fails to notify residents and provide documentation to the city clerk, pursuant to subsection (d)(5) above, shall render that organization ineligible to receive an event permit for a period of twelve (12) months unless special leave is granted by two-thirds supervote of the city council.

Police Officers Contract - Tentative Agreement

The following is a summary of the agreement that has been reached in principle for FY18-FY20 with the Police Officers bargaining unit, New England PBA Local 30. The City has agreed to the terms contained herein subject to the appropriation by the City Council. Local 30 voted to ratify the terms of this agreement on September 11, 2017.

ARTICLE X - Vacations

Add language that an officer with thirty (30) years' service shall be entitled to 6 days' vacation in addition to the level of benefits in effect for such officers under the 2000-2003 agreement. (Note: This was inadvertently left out of Patrol contract when Superior and Patrol unions split in 2006).

ARTICLE XI - Holidays

<u>Section 1</u>: Addition of Police Memorial Day (May 15) as a paid holiday. Police Memorial Day is an annual memorial where each year police officers killed in the line of duty are honored and remembered.

ARTICLE XIV - Wages

<u>Section 2</u>: Starting in FY20 (year three of this contract) the City shall include education incentive in calculation of night differentials (5% for second shift and 7% for third shift).



Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Newburyport as follows:

As to VARIANCES, add new Section X-H.6.R., as follows, with deletions double stricken-through, and additions double-underlined:

Except where a more specific affordable housing requirement applies under this Code, the board shall condition the grant of any variance for a project that will result in a net increase, or the substantial rehabilitation, or both, of at least ten (10) dwelling units, upon no less than ten percent (10%) of such dwelling units being made affordable to and reserved for occupancy by eligible households, for which affordability is assured in perpetuity, or for the life of the permitted project, whichever is shorter, so long as it is no fewer than 30 years, through the use of an affordable housing restriction that meets the statutory requirements of M.G.L. c. 184, § 31, the standards set out in 760 CMR 56.03(2), and the applicable guidelines of the Massachusetts Department of Housing and Community Development for the affordable units so produced to be credited on the Subsidized Housing Inventory (SHI). An eligible household is one whose annual income is less than eighty percent (80%) of the area-wide median income (AMI) as determined by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), adjusted for household size and using HUD's rules for attribution of income to assets. For purposes of calculating the number of units of affordable housing required within a project, any fractional unit shall be rounded up to the nearest whole number. Projects shall not be segmented to evade this requirement for affordability, and shall otherwise comply with subsections 3 and 4 of section XXIX-G. At the option of the applicant, it may pay an inlieu fee to the Newburyport Housing Trust in the amount of S per required affordable dwelling unit that is not included on site as part of the project.

Limitations

- (a) "Procedure" All road racing, walkathon, bicycle, or swimming events shall, through that event's organizer, board of directors, charity foundation or designee apply for authorization to hold the event through the Office of the City Clerk. The City Clerk upon review of the completed form will place the application on the regular City Council agenda. Upon following the procedures of the Council, as deemed appropriated in the sole judgment of the Council, the application will be considered approved if the Council votes favorably by majority. The event will name one person responsible on the application and shall provide contact information to include name, address and telephone number.
- (b) "Exemptions" Each event organizer or organization shall comply with this ordinance and no exemptions will be permitted.
- (c) "Course map", All applications shall be accompanied by a course map showing the event route, water stops, refreshment stops, and so-called "porta-potties". The course map shall also include any road closures, detours and parking areas. The course map shall be approved by Police, Fire, Department of Public Services, Parks Commission and Harbormasters Departments prior to submission to the City Clerk.
- (d) "Electronic Amplifier" Electronic amplifiers, loudspeakers and bullhorn use shall be requested at time of application. Under no circumstances will they be used for public address announcements or music before 8:00 A.M. except for Sundays when electronic amplifiers, loud speakers or bullhorns will be used for public address announcements or music before 9:00 AM. This shall be deemed a requirement for all permitted events regardless of type or location.

- (e) "Road Closure" No ways, public or private, boat ramps or parking lots controlled or patrolled by the city shall be closed without authorization. Authorization shall be considered granted only if said closure(s) are contained in the approved permit. It is the sole responsibility of the race organizers to notify residents ten (10) days in advance that neighborhood roads will be closed if no alternate route is available to those residents.
- (f) "Insurance" All events shall have an insurance policy or rider in effect for the event naming the "City of Newburyport" as an insured. The policy shall be no less than two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00).
- (g) "Event termination" If in the judgment of the City Marshal, Fire Chief or Department of Public Services (DPS) Director or designees thereof determine that an event is unsafe due to existing conditions, that event may be stopped, terminated or suspended. In the case of a multidiscipline event such as a triathlon, the Harbormaster or his/her designee may likewise stop, terminate or suspend the swimming portion for cause.
- (h) "Event and traffic Security" The City Marshal, Fire Chief, DPS Director or in the case of a triathlon, the Harbormaster can require special duty personnel to oversee the safety and security of the event. All special duty assignments will be paid by the event organizers.
- "Clean-up" The event organizers shall be responsible for post event trash collection, removal of signage. directional arrows, advertisements or other promotional material associated with the event.

13-101 Enforcement

- (a) "Regulations" Consistent with this ordinance, the city shall promulgate regulations to enforce and otherwise implement the provisions of this ordinance upon passage by the City Council. Any event previously approved by City Council shall be deemed permitted.
- (b) "Warning" In the circumstance that this ordinance is violated, the enforcement may consist of a warning. Any warnings issued for violation(s) will be reported to the City Clerk and City Council and may be used as a factor in future application approvals and denials.
- (c) "Noncriminal Disposition" If the city determines that a violation has occurred in which a noncriminal violation is issued, the named event organizer shall be penalized by a non-criminal disposition as provided bin Massachusetts General Law as adopted by the City of Newburyport as a general ordinance in Subsection 1-17 of Chapter 1 of the Code or Ordinances of the City of Newburyport in the amounts set herein in 13-101(d)
- (d) "Violation" The non-criminal violation shall be \$100.00 for the first offense and \$250.00 for second and subsequent offenses. Any non-criminal citations issued for violation(s) will be reported to the City Clerk and City Council and shall be used as a factor in future application approvals and denials.



To Whom it May Concern,

Regarding the Fuel ½ Marathon and 5k I cannot approve the application.

Having 2 races go through the downtown and later State and High St's cause major traffic congestion and delays.

Especially a ½ Marathon which goes through State and High near the end of the race, it is necessary to hold up traffic for extended lengths of time causing traffic to back up significantly. Traffic cannot be detoured as there is no re-routing option.

The only way to deal with this traffic is to stop it and only allow traffic to proceed when gaps in the runners occur.

The out and back section on Olde Rowley Rd is also concerning. The lead motorcycle had great difficulty negotiating this section last year as he was leading the race back into the race. The road is quite narrow and the number of runners exceeds the capacity of the road.

I highly recommend that the race organizers find an alternate route which takes the runners away from the congested areas of the City, not directly into them.

These are not new concerns. These were all made to race organizers 2 years ago. The race organizers have failed to address any of my concerns or take any corrective action.
