B Vogel – asks how to take gym out of the formula and acknowledge the space

B. Lane –include the gym and have it as a resource /community space for all

J. McCauley – Speaks to the 22k square feet of school space and not keep gym space in the RFI

E. Cameron – Supports the RFI and keeping it open with both school and gym included, uses Bridgewater example of successful school project.
