PROJECT SUMMARY: Provide a description of the Project, including the property involved and its proposed use.

We plan to install a shade structure at Perkins Park, a popular south end park with playground, tennis court, basketball courts, and ball field. The park is used by neighbors, little league and by Newburyport Youth Services for their spring and summer recreational programming. Shade has long been requested by Youth Services to support their programming.

PUBLIC BENEFIT: Describe in detail the benefits Newburyport will receive from the Project and how the Project fulfills the Community Preservation Committee's Project Evaluation Criteria.

Perkins Park is a popular, south end, neighborhood park with a playground, ball field, basketball court and tennis court. Newburyport Youth Services, the city agency which runs youth after school and summer recreational programming, has long been asking the Parks Commission to install a shade structure to help protect children from sun burns and other heat-related illnesses.

The US Consumer Product Safety Commission advocates for including shade on playgrounds in their *Public Playground Safety Handbook* saying, "According to the American Academy of Dermatology, research indicates that one in five Americans will develop some form of skin cancer during their lifetime, and five or more sunburns double the risk of developing skin cancer. Utilizing . . . manmade structures [will] help protect children's skin from the sun." In addition, shade will provide relief from heat, which is especially important at mid-day times when the playground is busiest and during full-day recreation programs when kids are at risk of heat-related illnesses.

The project supports the City's Open Space and Recreation Plan in the following ways:

"Goal 2: Maintain a high quality of parks and recreation areas that are safe, attractive, and provide a range of active and passive (informal) recreational opportunities for all residents and visitors. . . .

- Continue to plan for, budget for, and execute renovations to existing parks and facilities to create safe, accessible, and enjoyable parks and facilities.
- Implement improvements at city parks and recreation areas to ensure accessibility to people with a variety of levels of mobility, sense awareness, and mental capacity.
- Identify and secure funding for recreational improvements."

The project supports Master Plan

- "Goal NR-2: Maintain a high quality of parks, recreation areas, trails and other open spaces that are safe, attractive, preserve historic resources, and provide a range of active and passive recreational opportunities for all residents and visitors; and
- Strategy 3: Maximize use of all municipal parks and recreation facilities. Action 1 Foster close collaboration and coordination between the School Department and City Departments (Parks Department, DPS, etc.) to maximize the efficient utilization of existing facilities and field spaces."



Several stretches of asphalt along the original Clipper City Rail Trail are in need of repair due to the effects of damage by tree roots. Locations needing replacement include the High Street spur going from High to the main trail pathway; north of the Low Street bridge by the granite steps; south of the Low Street bridge; near the locomotive sculpture; north of the bridge over Merrimack Street; south of the rail road bridge from the bridge to the granite steps at Strong Street.

Perkins Park is a popular, south end, neighborhood park with a playground, ball field, basketball court and tennis court. The park is used by neighbors, little league and by Newburyport Youth Services for their spring and summer recreational programming. Shade has long been requested by Youth Services to support their programming. We plan to install a shade structure at the park, so support their programming and offer an essential amenity to all park users.

Project Management

PERMITTING

The Parks Department will file a building permit.

PROCUREMENT

The project team will solicit three written quotes for the shade structure itself and three written quotes for product installation.

CONSTRUCTION ADMINISTRATION

Parks Manager Michael Hennessey will review product and material submissions, and will act as site supervisor through all phases of the project on a daily basis.

Parks Director Lisë Reid will oversee the procurement process, manage project finances, review contractor invoices, hold project meetings and document progress through photographs and meetings notes.
