


• Built: 1851

Style: Italianate

• From National Register: "The building's plan resembles that of earlier public buildings; however, its large scale and exterior facings of pressed brick laid up in stretcher bond trimmed with dressed brownstone mark the introduction of these details into local architecture. Characteristic of its style, the building possesses a deep boxed cornice with brackets, and an ornate bracketed hood over the entry."

- 28,500 square feet
- Under a preservation restriction, so modifications will be minor and in keeping with the PR agreement
- In need of several interior upgrades and modifications
 - No effective wayfinding for the public, not welcoming
 - Office spaces are not organized effectively, scattered
 - Many offices have no access to natural light
 - Storage should be archived and/or purged
 - Retain and celebrate the building's history
 - System upgrades including AV, IT and HVAC



- \$47,000 in CPC funding has been requested by the Mayor's Office to hire a consultant to conduct a preliminary analysis, schematic design and phasing strategy, and cost estimates
- Requesting support from the Historical Commission for this effort
