My name is Bob Dupuis. I live at 11 Morin Rd, Newburyport, MA 01950 and am writing to express disagreement with the proposed item on the agenda this evening: Zoning Amendment - Wind Energy Facilities and Towers along I-95.

While I fully support the City's need for a renewable energy plan I cannot support this plan and believe it should be rejected, due to a number of reasons:

1) The proposed area includes a number of wetlands, streams, and vernal pool habitats that make up a diverse ecosystem supporting various wildlife including birds, coyotes, foxes, frogs, beaver, deer, etc..

2) The area is also a critical area for flood and water management for this area of town which has a significant amount of development impacting both water management and contaminant filtering for the Parker River watershed.

3) The density, due to limitations noted above, is small in comparison to other possible renewable energy projects such the proposed solar array on the site of the Crow Lane Landfill.

4) The negative impact on highly utilized open conservation space (which I have used daily for 9 years and I have seen grow in use exponentially over the past 2 years).

5) The negative impact to multiple residential communities, including my own neighborhood home to 48 school age and below children, which will have an outsized impact due to the requirement of a 300' residential buffer which, I believe was proposed to be that small in order to make the site viable for even a single turbine.

I encourage you to reject the proposal outright and to continue to work with City leadership to identify more suitable sites for higher output/lower impact renewable energy projects, including through public/private partnerships.
