Parker River Refuge Bird Tour: Friday, January 19, 9 AM -noon. 






The Massachusetts Senior Circuit Breaker Tax Credit information session: January 18th at 1PM Good news for Seniors! The Massachusetts Senior Circuit Breaker Credit has more than doubled for 2023. This refundable credit may be as much as \$2,590 for qualified renters or property owners. In anticipation, be sure you have records of your property tax payments for all 4 quarters of CALENDAR 2023, and any water or sewer bills. Renters should calculate the total rent paid for 2023, and have the name and address of the landlord they paid. You may be eligible for this credit even if you are not otherwise required to file a tax return. But you must file a Massachusetts tax return to claim it. AARP Tax Assistance– Februrary– April 15th; Tuesdays & Wednesday at the Newburyport **Senior Community Center**



Tax Aide Volunteers will be offering free tax preparation services at the Newburyport COA, beginning in early February and running through mid-April. They will prepare (and electronically file) Federal and Massachusetts tax returns for low to moderate income taxpayers. This free service is provided by the AARP Foundation, but you do

not need to be an AARP member. All volunteers are trained and certified. You can call the COA for an appointment beginning January 16th. You will receive a confirmation letter, specifying the time of your appointment and explaining what tax documents to bring with you. You do not need to wait until receiving all your documents before calling to schedule. Clients from prior years will receive a call in late December or early January, inviting them to schedule an appointment.

Happy New Year Council on Aging.!! 2024 is certainly shaping up to be an exciting year. I hope everyone had a wonderful holiday season. There is always so many wonderful things happening around the city during the holidays. The end of 2023 saw us welcome two new department heads to the city. Kevin Bourque as our Head Librarian and Sara Landry as our new Director of the Council on Aging. I am so thrilled to have these two dynamic professionals on board. One of the best parts of my job is recruiting talented individuals to come work for Newburyport. Both have hit the ground running and we are lucky to have them.

We had an election in the city in November and we will have two new city councilors and two new school committee members take office on January 2nd. Heath Granas will be the new Ward 3 Councilor and Ben Harman will be the new Ward 4 Councilor. Andy Boger and Kathleen Shaw will be our two new School Committee members. There are many initiatives that will be brought to the Council in the early part of the year. The first being a new Recreation Center at 59 Low Street. This Rec Center will be home to the new and improved Newburyport Recreation and Youth Services Department. The hope is to bring this plan to the entire community in the form of a public meeting and then submit the full design plan to City Council. Once the Council has a chance to vet the plan in a number of public meetings, we will submit a bond order for the build and also submit a change for zoning. Some other important initiatives the City Council will tackle early in 2024 will be zoning for the Waterfront West Overlay District and senior affordable housing at the vacant Brown School. I look forward to working with the Council on these important issues and I hope we can find some compromises to help move things forward. Collaboration is how difficult things get done.
