James Russell Executive Director of the Newburyport Custom House Maritime Museum "A Fun Overview of Irish History and Art"

Continue the celebration of St. Patrick's day by enriching your understanding of Irish art and history. Starting with a discussion of Newgrange, a world heritage, stone age monument older than Stonehenge and the Great Pyramids of Giza, Mr. Russell will explore the early Celtic period by examining beautifully crafted gold collars and clasps, the breathtaking illustrations of the Book of Kels, the development of the iconic Celtic Cross concluding his remarks with the influence of the Vikings and the Norse culture up to the 18th century.

Intergenerational Book Study- Join 8th graders from the Nock Middle School for this amazing program. The book is Remarkably Bright Creatures by Shelby Van Pelt. Book Summary: After Tova Sullivan's husband died, she began working the night shift at the Sowell Bay Aquarium, mopping floors and tidying up. Keeping busy has always helped her cope, which she's been doing since her eighteen-year-old son, Erik, mysteriously vanished on a boat in Puget Sound over thirty years ago. We are slowly but surely making our way through winter. I hope everyone is staying safe and staying warm.

We have the State of the City Address coming up on Wednesday February 28th at 7pm in the City Hall auditorium. This event is a great opportunity to celebrate all we have accomplished in the last year and also look ahead to what's next. It is free to attend and open to the public.

Also that night, we will be presenting the 2nd Annual Public and Community Service Awards. These awards celebrate incredible service performed in our great city. Community service was one of the themes of my campaign three years ago and I've tried to highlight unsung heroes doing great work when we can. These awards were a highlight last year and we have another great group to honor this year.

The three big issues we hope to address this year are building a Rec Center at 59 Low St, bringing in Senior Affordable Housing at the former Brown School and agreeing on a sensible development plan at Waterfront West. The Rec Center proposal is currently in committee at the City Council and the next public discussion will take place on March 4th. We are still working on an RFP to send out for the Brown School and we've had some great discussions with New England Development around their 4-plus acre parcel on the waterfront.

I want to personally thank those of you that made it to the polls on January 23rd for the Whittier Regional Vocational School Building Project Special Election. Over 21,000 votes were cast across 11 communities, where voters overwhelmingly came out to vote down the proposal for the \$444M school. Now we have an opportunity to pave a new path forward with Whittier and continue the great collaboration between the 11 communities that we saw during the weeks leading up to the vote. I am forming a task force made up of town administrators and elected officials from the 11 communities to revisit the Regional Agreement that formed Whittier back in 1967. We will use this group to work directly with the Whittier administration as they decide how best to renovate their current building. We have been told by Whittier that we will be getting no additional capital requests this year. We will also continue to work with our state legislators for help with Whittier at the state level.

Spring will be here soon. I am looking forward to warmer weather and of course St. Patrick's Day. I hope to see you all soon at the COA and maybe even at "Lunch with the Mayor"

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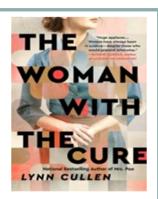

This month's title is **The Woman With the Cure** by Lynn Cullen.

"In 1940s and '50s America, polio is as dreaded as the atomic bomb. No one's life is untouched by this disease that kills or paralyzes its victims, particularly children. Outbreaks of the virus across the country regularly put American cities in lockdown. Some of the world's best minds are engaged in the race to find a vaccine. The man who succeeds will be a god.

But Dorothy Horstmann is not focused on beating her colleagues to the vaccine. She just wants the world to have a cure. Applying the same determination that lifted her from a humble background as the daughter of immigrants, to becoming a doctor —often the only woman in the room—she hunts down the monster where it lurks: in the blood.
